IS "A GOOD SORT" A BICYCLE TRUST

Emperor William Likes Cecil Rhodes on Sight. Wheel Makers Arranging a Big Combine.

Agree on Arrangements in Africa—Telegraph Lines and Railways—A Dinner. Ten of the Leading Makers Have Signed—Well Known Companies—Not this Year.

BERLIN, March 14.—The Tageblatt says that a contract has been concluded between the German Government and Cecil Rhodes, the British South African magnate, for the construction of a telegraph line in East Africa. The Tageblatt adds that a contract for building a railroad through the same territory is upon the point of conclusion, only a few details remaining to be concluded.

Both Emperor William and Empress Augusta Victoria, besides Baron von Buelow, the Foreign Minister, and other Ministers, with their wives, attended the banquet given by Sir Frank Lascelles, the British Ambassador, to Cecil Rhodes, who appears to have personally impressed everybody from the Emperor downward.

With the exception of the Agrarian and Conservative papers the whole press praises him. The Emperor is said to regard him as "just the sort of man that Germany wants."

It is understood that the Rhodesian schemes anticipate that Germany will ultimately possess Walfish bay, on the coast of Damaraland, South Africa.

KIPLING.

NEW YORK, March 16.—Rudyard Kipling is steadily improving. He was moved to-day from his rooms on the second floor to a suite on the floor above which has been in readiness for him for several days. He will have more sunshine there and the apartments are brighter than those he has been in.

The following statement was issued to-night: "The doctors say that Mr. Kipling has stood the removal to a brighter apartment without producing any disturbances, and that with the exception of a small area of pleural exudate at the lower portion of the right lung, all signs of the late disease have disappeared."

Mr. Kipling ate a hearty supper to-night and was permitted to read some proofs of a forthcoming book which he has written.

THERE WAS WARNING.

LONDON, March 17.—The Vienna correspondent of the Daily Chronicle says: "A startling story, emanating from an absolutely trustworthy source, is forwarded from St. Petersburg."

"It appears that on the day preceding the explosion of the navy powder magazine at La Goubran, near Toulon, the Russian Minister of War, Lieutenant-General Kouropatkine, received telegraphic warning that both in Toulon and at Petersburg powder stores would explode within twenty-four hours."

"He immediately drove to the powder magazine and, after an inspection, gave every employee three days' leave, installing fresh guards, establishing a military cordon and taking other precautions."

MOUNTAIN GUNS.

WASHINGTON, March 17.—The War Department has ordered sent to General Otis three light batteries and a half dozen Hotchkiss guns, to be used as mountain batteries. The general cabled last evening for these, saying that seventy-two horses should accompany the three batteries. These batteries are needed where it is impossible to move the heavier artillery now in the Philippines. The Hotchkiss guns can be mounted on mules, which can be secured in Manila and taken through the passes and over mountains, where it is impossible to move heavy armament.

SPAIN BORROWS.

MADRID, March 16.—The Spanish Government has concluded a loan of thirty million pesetas with the banking house of Urquijo. The money was handed over yesterday and will be devoted to paying the arrears due the Spanish troops who have served in Cuba.

NEW YORK, March 15.—The Herald to-morrow will say: The makers of bicycles have arranged the details of the formation of a trade combine that will involve capital to the amount of \$50,000,000. It is understood that ten of the leading makers of wheels have entered the combine, and that several others will probably be persuaded to add their signatures to the agreement. A. G. Spalding is credited with being the moving spirit in the proposed combine. With him are associated A. A. Pope and R. Philip Gormully of the Gormully & Jeffrey Manufacturing Company of Chicago.

No change in the bicycle business for the present year is contemplated, but next year each manufacturer's product will be marketed, the middlemen's profits being eliminated.

That all this had been carefully planned is shown by the recent organization of a \$5,000,000 bicycle-saddle company by A. L. Garford, former president of the National Cycle Board of Trade. To this is to be added the steel-tube combination and the wood-rim organization. Aside from the bevel-gear wheel, there are two chainless bicycles manufactured, each of which is declared by its maker to be the equal of those which will be controlled by the organization. Terms have already been offered to the independent concerns which will probably be accepted.

NEWSPAPER FOR HIMSELF.

It is perhaps not generally known that the German Emperor has a paper published and printed exclusively for himself and for the Empress. It is the Imperial Gazette of Berlin, containing a clear and concise daily summary of the world's news. The edition of this paper consists of two copies, doubtless the smallest edition of any paper published.

PHOTOGRAPHIC SUPPLIES.

CHICAGO, March 16.—The men who make photographic supplies and the men who sell them held another secret conference here to-day and made arrangements to perfect an organization of the manufacturers and dealers of the United States. The delegates admitted that prices would be raised somewhat.

A GREAT EDITOR DEAD.

CHICAGO, March 16.—Joseph Medill, editor-in-chief of the Chicago Tribune, died suddenly at San Antonio, Tex., this morning. The immediate cause of his death was heart disease, although for two years past the ailments of old age had caused him great suffering and sapped his strength. He was almost 76 years of age.

GOMEZ AND HIS DUTY.

HAVANA, March 15.—General Gomez has decided to proceed with the plans agreed upon for distributing the \$2,000,000 to the Cuban troops, on disbanding, as though the Military Assembly did not exist. He conferred for two hours to-day with General Brooke regarding details.

NEGROES MOBBED.

PALMETTO (Ga.), March 16.—Four negroes were killed and five were wounded early this morning by a mob of 100 men who shot them down while they were begging for mercy. The nine negroes were prisoners in a warehouse here, where they were held on suspicion of arson.

JOHN SHERMAN.

FORT DE FRANCE (Martinique), March 15.—John Sherman, who is a passenger on board the American Line steamer Paris, Captain Frederick Watkins, which arrived here to-day from Trinidad with the party of excursionists who are making a tour of the West Indian Islands, is suffering from pneumonia.
