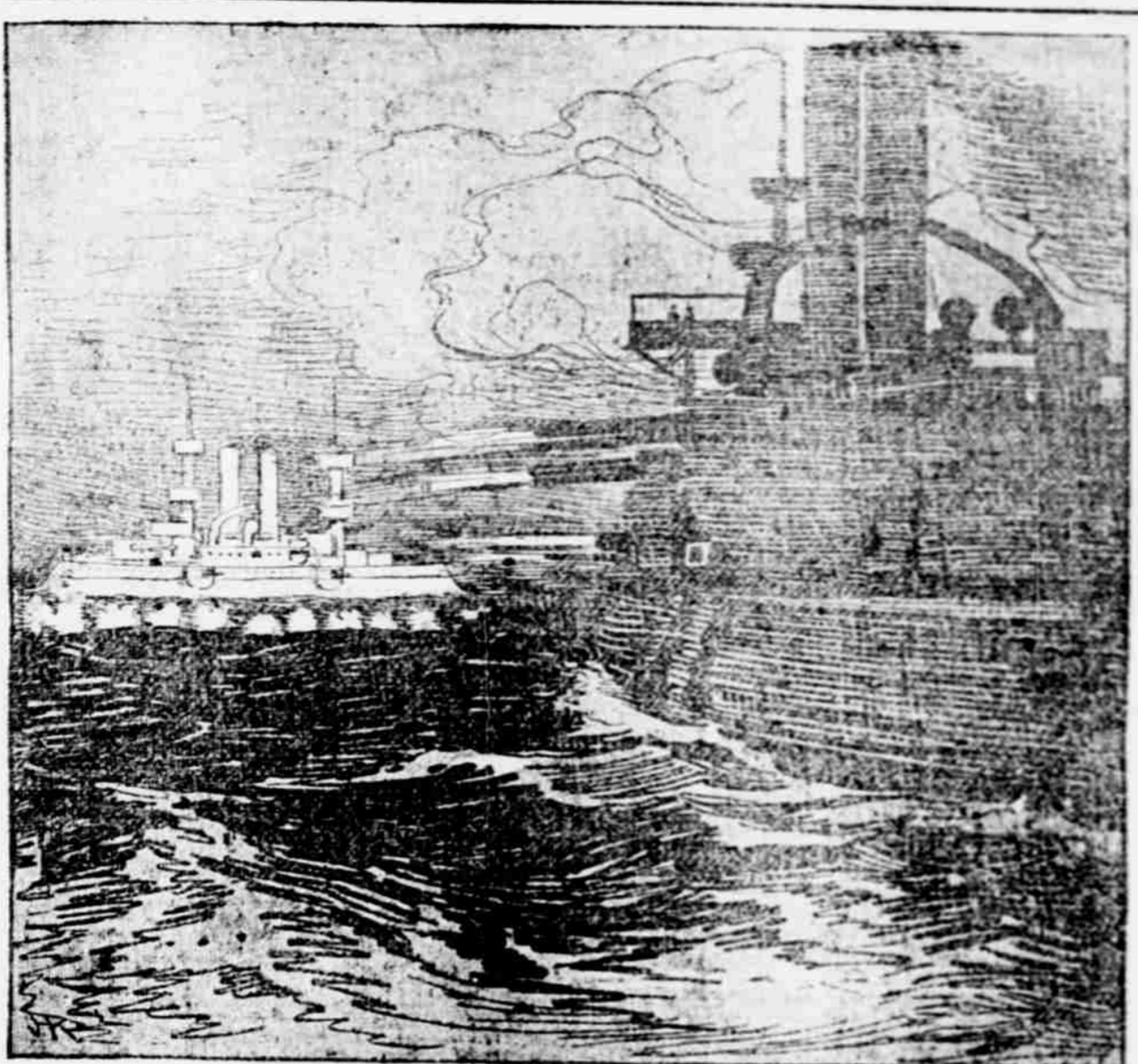

THE OTHER SIDE

Thomas Square Incident
in a New Light.

Deputy Marshal Chillingworth
Gives the Result of His Inves-
tigation of the Matter.

Referring to an article on hoodlums
at Thomas Square in yesterday's Ad-
vertiser, Deputy Marshal Chilling-
worth said later in the afternoon that
he had caused a thorough investiga-
tion of the matters complained of by
Captain Berger to be made.

"The mischief done to the gas fix-
tures was not the work of hoodlums
but of the boy employed by Mr. Cohen
to look after the gas plant," he said.
"This boy admitted to the police this
morning that in attempting to light the
jets last night he overbalanced him-
self and in trying to save himself from
falling clutched at one of the arms,
pulling it off. After turning the gas
off there was a small quantity left in
the pipe which ignited and burned his
eyebrows and lashes slightly. To screen
himself he plugged up several of the
other jets and attempted to throw the
blame on some of the boys frequenting
the park.

"With regard to the other matters
complained of," continued the Marshal,
"no complaints have been made to the
police. There is a policeman on duty
all the time on King street, but not on
Beretania. The department would
like to detail men for special duty at
the squares but we have not the men
to spare. The limited appropriation
for the police will not allow of put-
ting any more men on the force and
we have to distribute those we have to
the best advantage, and we have a
large district to cover with a very
small force. Any complaints by tele-
phone or otherwise sent in by people
living in the vicinity of Thomas Square
or by any one who may suffer from the
deprivations of boys such as related
in the article in your paper will be
promptly investigated by me."
