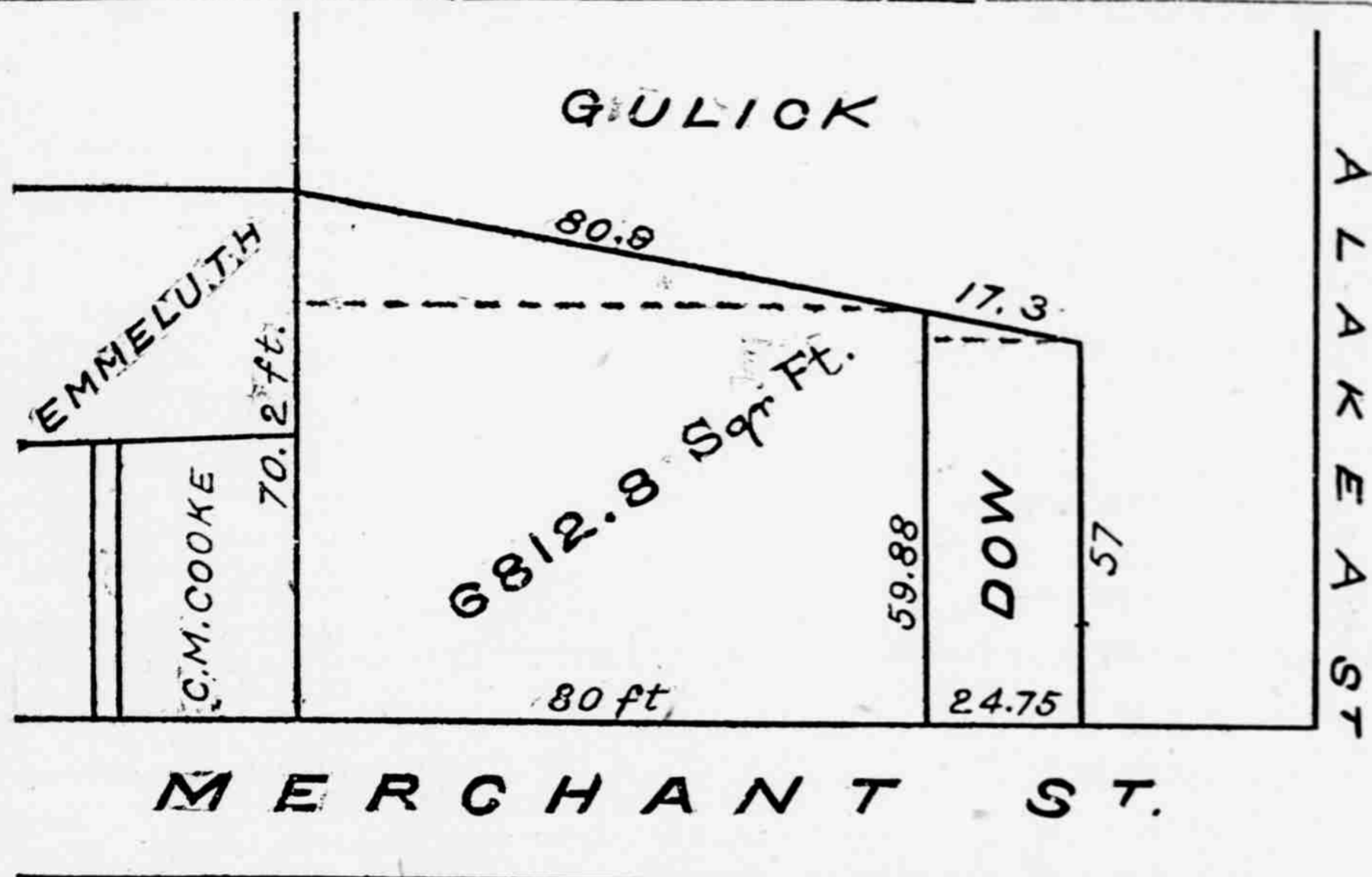

### WHARF AND WAVE.

The ship George Curtis is at the Railway wharf loading sugar.  
The collier Brutus, for Guam, sails at 10 a. m. tomorrow.

The Molokai steamers Lehua and Mokohi arrived yesterday.  
The City of Para sailed for Manila at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

Nineteen thousand six hundred bags of sugar awaiting shipment on Kaula.  
The United States cruiser Boston arrived at Yokohama July 2 from Nagasaki.

The steamer Nihau was at Waimea and the Waialeale at Hanalei last Saturday.

The steamer Helene, from Hamakua ports last Saturday, brought a full load of sugar.

The United States hospital ship Relief will get away for San Francisco about noon tomorrow.

The only liner due this week is the America Maru from San Francisco on next Friday afternoon.

The W. G. Hall goes to the Settlement next Friday night with the Board of Health and its guests.

Several hundred Japanese immigrants came on the City of Peking, and the Gaelic and the freighter Thyra also brought quite a number for the plantations.

Both the Star of Italy, with coal from Newcastle, and the F. L. Redfield, lumber-laden from Puget Sound, were compelled to anchor in the stream yesterday, no wharves being available.

The Gaelic was at Pacific Mail wharf last evening from Yokohama, having anchored in the stream in the morning, as the Peking had that berth. She took on no coal and discharged a light cargo and sailed for San Francisco at midnight.

There was quite a fleet of deep-water vessels off the harbor yesterday morning—the steamers Gaelic, Peking and Thyra, schooner F. S. Redfield and ship Star of Italy. With the sailing of the three big liners also during the afternoon the pilots were busy all day.

The Norwegian steamer Thyra is at Oceanic wharf with over 1,000 tons of Oriental freight. She is a large carrier with a capacity of 2,419 net and 6,450 dead tons. The Thyra has been chartered for three years by the California and Oriental Steamship Co. She sails for San Diego via San Francisco tomorrow evening with sixty Japanese immigrants and 3,000 tons of freight in transit.

The delayed Pacific Mail liner City of Peking, from Oriental ports, docked at the company's wharf yesterday morning, and after discharging a light cargo sailed at 7 o'clock with a full list of passengers for San Francisco. The Peking was twenty-three days from Nagasaki, where she was in quarantine about a week and was, through stress of weather in the Inland Sea, delayed another two days. She was due here the 11th inst.
