STILL THEY COME

The Transports "Valencia" and "Sikh" in Port.

1000 More Men for Service in the Philippines—List of Officers on Board.

The United States transport Valencia, from San Francisco, 5th inst., with 9 officers, 425 recruits for the Thirty-seventh Infantry and Eleventh Cavalry, arrived in port a few minutes before 12 o'clock last night. The officers on board are: Captain Charles B. Harden, in command, Eighteenth Infantry; First Lieutenant H. H. Martin, adjutant, Nineteenth Infantry; First Lieutenant O. E. Hunt, Eighteenth; Second Lieutenants C. M. Smith, Eighteenth Infantry; W. S. Sinclair, Fourteenth Infantry; C. M. Gordon, Sixteenth Infantry; H. M. Stanford and W. W. Colt, signal corps; Captain H. L. B. Davies, Thirty-third Infantry; Surgeon Major J. C. Broom, Assistant Surgeons H. M. Cohen and Robert Boyd and Civilian M. K. Nelson.

The ship's officers are: Captain J. M. Lane, Chief Engineer R. Pierson, First Assistant Engineer J. J. McDonald, Second Assistant Engineer George Scott, Third Assistant Engineer W. H. Howell, First Officer Frank Turner, Second Officer Dolliver, Third Officer Blaine, Purser W. B. Fielding, Steward Matthew Houston.

The Valencia left San Francisco a few minutes after the Zealandia and City of Para and experienced good weather all the way to port. She is docked at Brewer's wharf.

The transport Sikh from Portland 3d inst. with the balance of the 35th Regiment United States Infantry arrived off port at 2:30 this morning, and anchored outside till daylight.

SAMOAN MATTERS.

Last Proclamation of the Three Consular Representatives.

In the last Government meeting held on September 16th the following Proclamation was issued by common accord of the three Consular Representatives and the President of the Municipality:

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas, from several meetings held by the Provisional Government of Samoa with the Chiefs of the respective parties, it appears that peace is now restored, and that the temporary necessity for any restrictions as provided for by the order of the High Commission and by the Government Proclamation of August 12th, no longer exists:

It is therefore, with the approval of the President of the Municipality of Apia ordered, that so much of the above mentioned order, and Proclamation, as required non-resident Chiefs and people of Samoa to withdraw from the Municipality of Apia, is suspended for the present, and all Samoans are permitted to visit the Municipality for all legitimate purposes, as long as peace is maintained.

ISELIN AND LIPTON.

NEW YORK, Oct. 3.—C. Oliver Iselin, managing owner of the cup defender Columbia, when asked for a statement on today's race, said: "I do not consider today's race a fair test of the two boats at all, for it was too fluky for any one to see which was doing the better work at any point of sailing. I have just as much confidence in the Columbia now as I ever had."

Sir Thomas Lipton said: "I want you to put me down as saying that there never was in all the world, not even in England, as clear a course as we had today, and I want to add from the bottom of my heart that it reflects the greatest possible credit upon the authorities who had in charge the task of keeping it clear. Throughout the entire contest the line was marked on either side of it as clearly as if one had taken a pen and drawn it upon a piece of paper. As to my boat, I knew she was a flyer in a stiff breeze. Today's work proved that she is no sluggard in a light one, and I am prepared to say that she is a far better boat than I thought she was. As to the Columbia, no boat was ever better handled. Nothing could be more beautifully perfect than the way she was sailed. Everything she is capable of was, I believe, brought out of her."
