PARIS' LATEST CREATIONS FOR THE FASHIONABLES



PARIS, Sept. 7.—This is the season of the year when the ultra-elegantes, not content with the bounties which accepted Fashion has showered upon them, desire new and special models, a little different and in advance of the more well known ones to be created for them. The dressmakers are not slow to respond to such requirements, with the result that new ideas are constantly brought out, and it is the feminine contingent of the dramatic world particularly who are the first to profit by the latest devices of the great couturiers. A beautiful gown is just completed by Doucet and will be worn by a successful young actress who will play the "ingenue" role in one of the coming new plays. The gown is delightfully dainty and girlish in spite of the short train which makes it appropriate for evening wear at Casino gatherings or social evenings, as well as for uses which will outlive the summer.

The skirt has a foundation of white taffeta which is shaped close to the figure and flares gradually from the knees downward and extends suddenly from a point about twenty centimeters from the hem. This flare is effected by the deep ruffle of pleated white taffeta and also by the two ruffles of white Chantilly tulle embroidered with silk polka dots and closely pleated. The entire foundation is covered with this tulle, which is caught into narrow tucks around the hips for the purpose of close adjustment below the waist

line, and veiling the silk in light folds which are caught at the knees into four full puffs. The skirt closes in the back and the placket is hidden under the train piece of cream colored taffeta artistically painted with sprays of pink roses and green foliage. The back forms a double box-pleat falling unconfined to the hem of the skirt and is unlined and finished only with a deep hem at the sides and below. The tight bodice of white taffeta is covered with dotted Chantilly tulle fuffed to effect a blouse and held below the bust by a deep belt of rose-colored faille veiled with rose colored mousseline de sole and closing in front under a chou of the same mousseline. The rose faille is shaped and boned with the bodice and the drapery of mousseline de sole is caught with a hidden stitch neck and then to simulate the folded belt. This inevitable bolero is likewise seen in this creation. It is made of "rose sprigged" taffeta like that of the train and is bordered with a flounce of fine white Chantilly lace. A novel feature is the wide shoulder collar of taffeta, likewise edged with a lace ruffle, as are also the short, tight and unlined sleeves of taffeta, which reach hardly to the elbows, and are finished with a tiny saucer cuff of taffeta. There is a high unlined stock of folded rose colored mousseline de sole with a rosette and jabot of the same material in front.

Long white silk gloves are worn with this toilette, and the hat that matches

it is a white Neapolitan trimmed with pink roses and foliage.

Gold galloons braid and embroidery will play an important part in the dressmaking and millinery field as long as the fad for "gilding" lasts. Doucet is the author of a model which brings this new mode of decoration into play in a most effective as well as artistic manner. The gown is a demi-toilette of practical value, as by the omission of a guimpe and sleeves of ochre gypure it may be transformed into a conventional ball gown. The skirt is of khaki colored satin cut circular and fitting smoothly over the hips and back, where the fullness is acquired by the bias slant of the seam. The flare below is attained by a deep flounce of rich ochre gypure applied in irregular undulations with a fitted band of embroidery done with gold thread and studded with small turquoises and diamonds. Additional fullness is given by a pleating of satin under the lace and supporting it. The bodice has a blouse of ochre gypure over a foundation of khaki satin and is deeply décolleté and edged around the décolletage with gold embroidery. A corset of gold cloth edged with gold embroidery confines the waist line, and bands of the same embroidery form the shoulder straps. For less dressy wear a yoke and tight sleeves of unlined ochre gypure are worn, and the design of the lace is outlined with gold thread.

CONTRACT LET FOR THE GREAT PUMPS

The Oahu Plantation Orders Two Six Million Gallon Machines.

H. A. Allen, general western representative of the Fraser & Chalmers Company of Chicago, before leaving on the Australia secured the contract for supplying the Oahu plantation with 6,000,000 gallon Reidler pumps of the most improved pattern. This is a large contract and one of the most important given in the last few months. The pumps will be located underground in the manner of mining pumps. The boiler plant will be located on the surface.

The order for the pumps will be left with the main office of the company when Mr. Allen makes his visit on his present trip. The specifications have been made up, the general design accepted, and work on the construction of the pumps will be commenced at an early date.

RICHARDS STREET TO BE FINISHED

Street Department Doing Active Work all Over the City.

Commissioner of Streets Campbell will soon begin the work of completing the macadamizing of Richards street. The United States Government has let the contract for the curbing around the Naval Reservation at the foot of Richards street and with this in position the street in that vicinity can soon be put in good condition.

Today a force of men will be placed on the widening of King street through Palama near the property owned by ex-Queen Liliuokalani. The street is to be widened by sixteen feet on the mauka side at that point and a strip will also be taken off the makai side.

The Pauoa valley road is nearing completion and work is progressing on the new Pali road, about fifty feet or more being finished daily by the force of men which it at work there. Liliha street which has been badly torn up is now being put in shape after the work done in laying the sewer. The patching gang is also at work along the Waikiki road, and is doing good work there.

The stone crusher has been sent out to the vicinity of the new bridge at Kalihi stream and work will soon begin on laying the foundation for that structure.
