AFFAIRS OF TERRITORY

Tramways Want to Put In Loops.

OFFER OF A CEMETERY

War Department Refuses to Part With a Piece of Land Near Moanalua.

At yesterday's meeting of the Governor's council Mr. Dole notified the members that he had authorized the inspectors of election to increase the number of voting compartments in some of the districts; the number of voters was too great to allow every man cast his ballot within the specified time. He stated that he had taken this action as a preventive against disturbances.

Mr. McCandless, Superintendent of Public Works, read a communication from the Hawaiian Cemetery Association whose burial grounds are located near Pearl City, in which they stated certain conditions under which they would agree to bury paupers who would have to be buried by the Government. They stipulated to perform this work at so much for each body. The proposition was discussed and rejected.

Manager Pain of the Hawaiian Tramways Company gave notice through Mr. McCandless that his company desired to proceed with the construction of switch loops on King and Beretania streets in order to run more cars. The switches would be located half way between the present ones. Mr. McCandless read a draft of his reply which was to the effect that the Tramways Company should furnish a map and specifications showing just what they intended to do. It is thought this action is a new move on the Tramways Company's part to gain control of King street where the Rapid Transit Company has already laid its rails.

A letter from the Department of State, Washington, enclosing one from the War Department, was read by Governor Dole. The contents dealt with a piece of land near Moanalua which the Government desired to use as a cemetery site. The answer from the War Department was to the effect that the piece of land in question was the only section available here which could be used for military purposes and that other lands would be so expensive that it preferred to retain possession of the property.

Treasurer Lansing was authorized to transfer from the current to the loan fund, the sum of \$24,000.

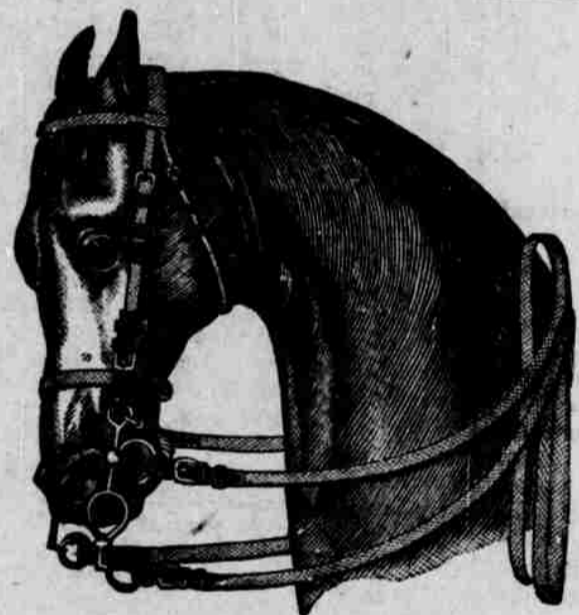
