PUMP DESTROYED BY A CLOUDBURST

Much Damage Done at Kaunakakai by the Kona Storm Last Week.

The Kona storm worked havoc at Kaunakakai. The American Sugar Company's plantations are situated there, and they felt the force of the storm greatly.

Hundreds of tons of rock and masonry now cover the pumping machinery. Many of the buildings of the cloudburst, which, starting some 2000 feet up the mountain, descended with terrific force and carried everything before it.
