RUBBER INDUSTRY.

More than a hundred million dollars' worth of India rubber has been imported into the United States during the past four years, and more than sixty million dollars' worth in the last two years. A decade ago the annual importations of India rubber amounted to about \$15,000,000; now they exceed \$30,000,000, and are steadily increasing.

The above statement is suggested by the receipt by the Treasury bureau of statistics of a publication detailing the systematic efforts being made for the cultivation of India rubber trees and plants in the British colonies, especially those of Central and South Africa.

India rubber is not, as is generally supposed, the product of a single tree, but on the contrary is produced from a variety of trees and plants. Some of these flourish only in a moist soil and atmosphere, while others thrive on stony soil, provided they receive ample though intermittent rainfall; though in all cases a tropical or subtropical climate is requisite.

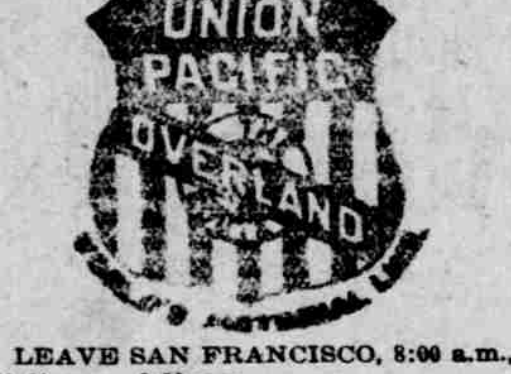
