WEATHER CONDITIONS IN HAWAII FOR OCTOBER

Meteorological Summary for Month as Prepared by Curtis J. Lyons.

Temperature mean for the month, 76.9 F.; normal, 76.3; average daily maximum, 82.4; average daily minimum, 71.8; average daily range, 10.6; greatest daily range, 19 degrees; least daily range, 6 degrees; highest temperature, 87; lowest, 65 degrees.

Barometer average, 29.960; normal, 29.995 (corrected for gravity by -.007); highest, 30.11; lowest, 29.78; greatest 24-hour change, -.08. The lowest came a day or two before the torrential rains of the 16th. The storm of the ten days following was a high barometer storm, probably the southwest side of a large cyclonic disturbance.

Relative humidity, 71.0; normal, 72.5; mean dew point, 66.9; normal, 66.2; absolute moisture, 7.22; grains per cubic foot, normal, 7.06.

Rainfall, 6.88 inches; normal, 2.40; rain record days, 23; normal, 19; greatest rainfall in one day, 2.68; at Luakaha, monthly rainfall, 21.21; in one day (16th), 8.15; Kapiolani Park, 2.12 for the month.

The artesian well level rose from 32.85 to 33.19 feet above mean sea level.

Trade wind days, 29 (6 of N. N. E.); normal number of trade wind days, 22. Average force of wind, Beaufort scale, 27. Cloudiness (tenths of sky), 5.2; normal cloudiness, 4.3.

Approximate percentages of district rainfall as compared with normal: Hilo, 180 per cent; Hamakua, 125 to 220; Kohala, 170; Waimea, 150; Kona, 200; Kau, 200; Puna, 200; Maui, 150 to 200; Oahu, 150 to 400; Kauai, 150 to 250.

Average temperature: Pepeekeo, Hilo, 100 feet elevation, mean maximum, 80.4; mean minimum, 69.9. Waimea, Hawaii, 2,730 feet elevation, 77.3 and 66.6. Kohala, 385 feet elevation, 84.1 and 77.1. Kulaokahu (W. R. Castle's), 60 feet elevation, highest, 87; lowest, 66; average, 78.3. Kilauea, Kauai, 325 feet elevation, average maximum, 80.9; average minimum, 71.7.

Earthquakes noted: Hilo, 10th, at 11 p. m.; Hilo and Pepeekeo, 12th at 3:45 a. m. Thunder and lightning on Hawaii on 9th, 15th, 16th and 17th; Oahu, 15th and 16th. Hail at Luakaha, Nuuanu, on 16th.

Heavy rains on the 9th, Hawaii and Kauai; 9.55 inches in a few hours at Kapoho. On the 18th, over the entire group; at Ahimann, Oahu, 9.10 inches in 24 hours.

DRUGGISTS ARE BETWEEN THE DEVIL AND DEEP SEA

Local Liquor Laws on One Hand and Internal Revenue Regulations on the Other.

Local liquor laws and the internal revenue laws are so far from identical that a great deal of clashing grows out of any effort on the part of a drug store to cater to the demand for alcohol. The penal statutes prohibit the sale of clear alcohol, but does not restrict the sale of methylated spirits.

Now comes the internal revenue laws of the United States, defining the mixing of other ingredients with alcohol as rectifying. A rectifier's license costs \$100. No druggist in the city has such a license, therefore the revenue department is sending out the following communication to all druggists:

"Section 3248 of the Revised Statutes defines distilled spirits, spirits alcohol and alcoholic spirit * * * to be ethyl-alcohol, hydrated oxide or ethyl, or spirit of wine * * *"

"Every person who * * * shall by mixing such spirits, wine, or other liquor with any materials, manufacture any spurious imitation, or compound liquors for sale under the name of whisky, brandy, * * * or any other name, is to be regarded as a rectifier and as being engaged in the business of rectifying."

"There being no provision for stamping spirits on the premises of retail liquor dealers, they are not permitted to reduce the proof of spirits by the addition of water or otherwise."

"* * * and the term rectified spirits * * * must be construed to cover all spirits included in the statute definition."

"The mixing of wood alcohol with spirits constitutes rectification."

Kihei Boom Busted.
Yesterday the Kihei boom busted. It seemed to fall of its own weight and the people who had lately bought and sold at an advance were congratulating themselves. The tenth assessment of 2 1/2 per cent on the stock became due yesterday and as a result there was more stock offered than there were buyers for. The stock, which sold during the first of the week at \$14 per share, was offered as low as \$13.50 yesterday, and that with the last assessment paid. The assessable stock sold yesterday at \$14 and eight shares of the paid-up was sold for \$15 a share. The assessable closed at \$12.50 bid and \$13.50 asked and the paid-up, on which there has not been a quotation until yesterday for a long time, closed at \$14 bid and \$17 asked.
