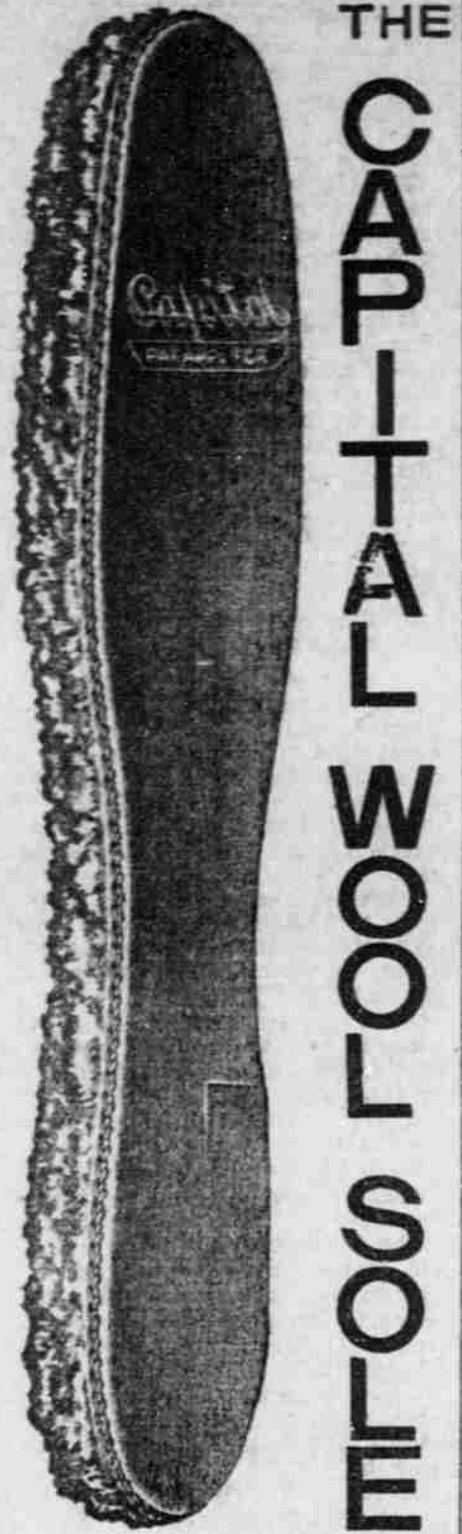

BOARD OF HEALTH HEARS FOOD REPORT

Milk Supply Better in Quality Than Ever Before.

SHOREY'S TELLING STATISTICS

SEVEN SAMPLES FOUND TO BE BELOW STANDARD—MILK DEALERS IN TROUBLE.

Dr. Oliver Reports on Molokai—Fourteen Deaths There—One Birth. Eight Cases of Chicken Pox. Schools Closed.

Nothing of any importance developed at yesterday's meeting of the Board of Health. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved and then the secretary read Food Commissioner Shorey's report for the month of November.

This report was, in part, as follows:

Honolulu, Dec. 2, 1901. Dr. H. C. Sloggett, President Board of Health:

Sir: I submit herewith a report of the work done in my department during the month of November, 1901.

The usual milk inspection has been carried on; and so far as the milk supply of Honolulu can be judged by the samples taken and the report of the past month that at any time during the period I have been in charge of the work. Not only are there few names on the "black list," but the average of samples passed as up to or above standard has been high.

Samples found to be below standard gave on analysis the following figures:

Table with 2 columns: Sample No., Total Butter solids, Fat. Rows include Tavares, Nohriga, Nakatani, F. Martins, J. Mattos, Private complaint, Private complaint.

Sample made basis of prosecution: Total Butter Solids, Fat.

Table with 2 columns: Case in district court, F. Correa, selling adulterated milk, fined \$25.

Cases in circuit court, A. Doak selling adulterated milk, appeal from district court of Honolulu. Appeal withdrawn.

Tong Chong Tai, selling decomposed sausage; appeal from district court of Honolulu. Nolle prosequitur.

A sample of water used by poi maker in Kalihi valley was examined and found to give on analysis the following figures:

Table with 2 columns: Parts per million, Total solids, Chlorine, Free ammonia, Albuminoid ammonia, Nitrates.

This water was taken from an open ditch in a taro patch, and carries in suspension considerable organic matter, so that an analysis was hardly necessary to determine its character, which I consider bad. This water, in addition to being used for making poi, is used for drinking, etc., by a large number of people, residing in that district, and while the fact that these people use it apparently without harm, would prevent its being condemned, the fact remains that this water is exposed to infection both from animals and human habitations for a considerable distance above the point where the sample was taken, and a single case of an infectious disease in the upper part of the valley would be a menace to a considerable number of the community.

Eleven samples of syrup and molasses, partially reported on before, were examined for the presence of bleaching agents, and such found in one sample only. "Pelican Open Kettle Louisiana Molasses," obtained from Chun Yung Fishmarket was found to contain an undue amount of sulphuric acid present as a sulphate. The amount of sulphuric acid present was 0.274 of the weight of molasses.

A sample of Hawaiian salt on partial analysis gave the following figures: Sodium chloride (salt) 94.4 p. ct, Lime 0.382 p. ct, Magnesia 0.260 p. ct, Sulphuric acid 0.692 p. ct, Moisture, dirt, and matter insoluble in water 3.156 p. ct

The amount of other salts than common salts in it will be noted very small.

A sample of canned lobster, labeled "Star Brand Picnic Lunch Lobster, Portland Packing Co." obtained from Wing Lee, Nuuanu street, was found to be in bad condition, decomposition having set in and the surface of the can corroded. The stock of this brand in this store, 30 cans, was condemned as unfit for food.

One sample each of powdered cathartics and extract of cantharides were examined; no adulteration found. One sample of granulated sugar examined; no adulteration. One sample of lard examined; no adulteration. One sample of pills (proprietary) examined; no adulteration.

Respectfully, E. C. SHOREY, Food Commissioner. The above report was approved and placed on file. Dr. Oliver, in a letter to the board

reported satisfactory conditions at Molokai. There were fourteen deaths during the month, including the death by supposed drowning in the sea of one of the inmates of the Baldwin home and the death of two infants from inanition. One birth was reported.

The attendance at the bath houses has been up to the average. There were eight cases of chicken pox during the month, and as three cases developed in one day it was thought advisable to close the schools for a time.

Fever visiting Molokai take generally the form of a simple continued fever or an asthmatic form of remittent fever.

Bids for drugs for the leper settlement and insane asylum were considered, after which the board adjourned to meet again Wednesday of next week.

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS.

Apparatus for Gamewell System is Now Ready to be Installed.

Colonel Coffey, who lately installed the Gamewell alarm system in Manilla, is in the city making arrangements for the immediate installation of that system of police and fire calls in Honolulu.

A foreman and master workman arrived yesterday in the Sierra and Col. Coffey will hire the rest of his labor locally.

The boxes, connections and other apparatus come complete from the Gamewell company and all that is needed for the installation is the setting up of the various parts. Work will be started early next week.
