### PEARL HARBOR CHANNEL MARKS

NOTICE TO MARINERS—PEARL HARBOR, ISLAND OF OAHU, TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

Notice is hereby given that the mid-channel entrance buoy, nun, black and white perpendicular stripes, marking the entrance to Pearl Harbor, Island of Oahu, adrift 15 February, 1904, was replaced 22 June, 1904, in 33 feet of water, on the range N.N.W. 1/4 W. for the 30-foot dredged channel leading into Pearl Harbor, upon the following magnetic bearings:

Ahua Point, N.E. by E. 1/4 E.  
Right Tangent Diamond Head Point, E. 1/4 S.  
Windmill, N.W. 1/4 N.  
Right Tangent Queen Emma House, N. by W.

This buoy is on the range at the mouth of the channel through the reef. It should be passed close to on either side as the channel is only 200 feet wide.

Notice is also given that the range beacons used for passing through the 30-foot dredged channel, through the reef, leading into Pearl Harbor, Island of Oahu, reported missing 6 May, 1904, were replaced 22 June, 1904. The front range mark is a beacon in the form of a diamond of 6 feet square and the rear range mark a beacon in the form of a windmill (2 1/2-foot boards crossed), both beacons being whitewashed. They are on the range N.N.W. 1/4 W. which is the mid-channel course through the dredged portion of the reef. The apex of the diamond shows just under the cross boards of the rear range mark. These range marks are erected on the submerged coral reef near the Queen Emma House.
