PRIMA FACIE CASE MADE

Supreme Court Decides Cane Land Goes to the Plantation on a New Deal.

Yesterday the land department disposed of the lease of 1000 acres of land at Honokaa, about 735 acres of which is agricultural land, to the Honokaa plantation for the next five years at the rate of \$3311 a year.

This is a part of the present lands of the plantation, and the new lease is so worded that the government can, at any time that it feels so disposed, set aside the lands, or any part of them, for purposes of settlement, the rentals of the lands to be reduced in proportion to the amount of the lands so taken away from the body of the leasehold.

In other words, this seems to be a breaking away from the old leasehold system. Heretofore, when lands have been leased they have passed absolutely into the possession and use of the lessee, and that has been all there was to it.

The Kamaole lands, in the Kula district of Maui, were sold yesterday to the Henry Waterhouse Trust Company for \$1620, the upset price being \$1250. There were 455 acres in the tract.

KALIBIWAENA SCHOOL MUST BE SMALLER

Because the San Francisco fire has caused a great rise in the price of lumber, the Kalibiwaena schoolhouse, if it is built, must be considerably diminished in size, and the present plans for the structure must be abandoned.

The appropriation for the construction of the school made by the last Legislature amounted to \$25,000. On the basis of this the plans were drawn for a nine-room schoolhouse which would have cost between \$18,000 and \$19,000 at the time the appropriation was made.

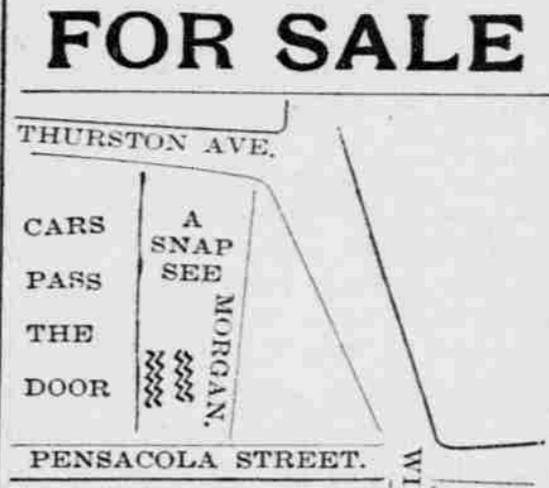

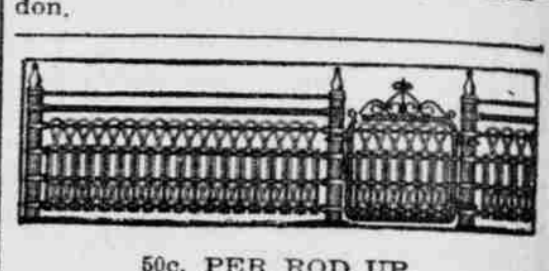
