TREATING DIPHTHERIA LOAN COM. MEETS

The following is a translation from a Norwegian Chicago Newspaper that prints part of the bulletin.

46 children that died in Chicago during the last two weeks were in fact murdered, says the Board of Health in their last bulletin. The children died from diphtheria and every one of them could have been saved if Anti Toxin had been used in time.

When Anti Toxin is used at any early stage it is a sure remedy against the further development of the sickness. It can be had free and will be injected free from the Board of Health upon the request of either doctor or parents.

No child needs to die from lack of it. The Anti Toxin that could have saved these 46 children still remains on the shelf while the children are in their graves.

If Anti Toxin is injected the first day, the sickness will have no power. The longer it is postponed the nearer death comes to the child. If Anti Toxin is used the first day the patient will have 99 chances of 100 to recover, and if the use of it is postponed until the 4th day, 35 of every 100 will succumb.

The Bulletin gives the following rules for the prevention of the sickness:

Do not let children come near anyone who has a sore throat. Let the Board of Health know of every case of sore throat in your neighborhood. If a case of sore throat appears in your family call a doctor at once. Do not use family remedies and do not wait for white spots to appear in the throat, as the worst cases commence in the nose and creep down in the throat and show no white spots. If a case is the least bit suspicious, Anti Toxin ought to be used at once. In most cases it is best not to wait for a diagnosis, but use Anti Toxin.

If you are too poor to pay for Anti Toxin you can get it free from the Board of Health. It can also be had free from drug stores on Prescription from doctors. If you are too poor to call a doctor go to the nearest drug store and ring up the Board of Health and they will send a doctor. If a case of diphtheria appears in your family let all your other children be injected with anti toxin to protect them against the sickness. If the patient cannot have proper care at home send him to the Isolation hospital where they get the best of care free.

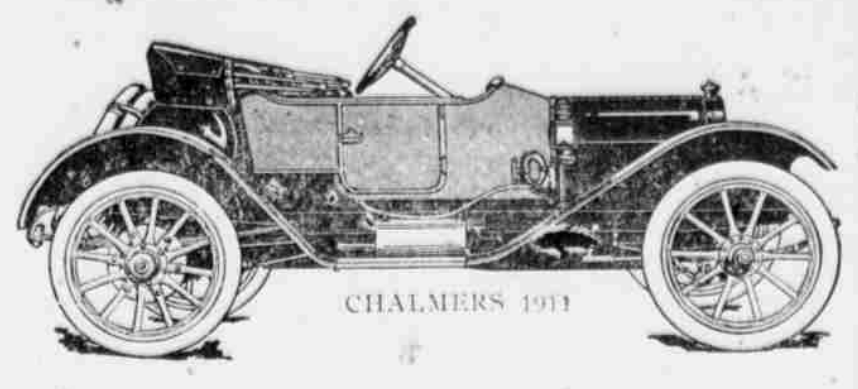
