## University Huskies Arrive for Basketball Series With Kauaians

The University of Hawaii basketball team arrived on Kauai via the Claudine this morning to tackle the local teams in four game series. Eight players and Mr. and Mrs. Klum are the university party while "Shorty" Hoch, the well known referee from Honolulu, also is with the party. Mr. Hoch refereed all the games in the recent Inter Island tournament in Honolulu and Kauai is very fortunate in being able to secure the services of such a capable official.

The varsity men making the trip are Blaisdell, the Chung brothers, Wong, Fuller, Farden, Matsuguma, and Forbes.

The varsity will tackle their hardest proposition tonight at the Lihue Armory when they meet the fast Kauai high school team. The varsity will be handicapped by not having their hand legs after the sea trip last night and by the smallness of the local court. The high school boys have been working hard for this game and are in excellent shape.

Coach Klum has not announced the line up he will use against the local teams, but there is no doubt that he will start his strongest line up, as he is not taking any chances on being surprised.

The high school will start their regular team with Camara and Lydgate at forward, Ernest Wedemeyer at center, and Cheatham and Sinichi at guard. The high school team is probably the best on Kauai today and should give the varsity their hardest battle.

Lihue will meet the varsity on Wednesday evening at the Lihue Armory in the second game. Lihue will have a tougher battle on their hands, as the varsity will have an opportunity to get accustomed to the court and will have lost their sea-legs. If Lihue can show the form that they had at the first of the season they are going to make a good game of it.

Thursday, the varsity will journey to Makaweli and meet the Makaweli team at the community house court. The varsity will have an opportunity to show local fans some real basketball as they will be on a court somewhere near the size they are accustomed to. They will be outweighed by the Makaweli team, but speed and team work should stand them in good stead. West side fans are pulling for the Makaweli team to spring a surprise on the varsity.

This game should be a battle all the way and should draw one of the biggest crowds on the island. Makaweli as been working hard and will be able to put their strongest team on the court. Betsui and Auld will start at forward, Damkroger at center, and Beam and Becroft at guard.
