Three Wheelmen Make a Circuit on

Thos. P. Cummins, J. K. Kalanianaole and A. L. C. Atkinson returned from a pleasure tour around the island on their cycles on Sunday afternoon. The wheelmen started to make the circuit at 5:50 o'clock Saturday morning and arrived at the top of the Pali, a distance of 6 miles, at 6:45 o'clock, less than an hour from the start. This is considered fast time as the road is uphill. The trio walked down the Pali and immediately made for the Kaneohe courthouse. From there the, went over to Heeia place, a few hundred yards further on, and were met and entertained to lunch by Mr. F. Buchholtz, the genial manager of the Heeia plantation.
