KINAU BRINGS A LARGE CARGO AND PASSENGER LIST.

Mark Belmont Off for the American Metropolis with a Big Cargo of Our Sweet Product.

The P. M. S. S. China is due from the Coast. The schooner Ada will sail for Hilo direct on Friday with freight.

The bark Alden Besse is rapidly unloading her inward cargo at Oceanic dock.

The Klauwa Hou came in from Hawaii this morning with a load of sugar and cattle. The schooner Mille Morris arrived in this morning with a cargo of rice for Hymau Bros.

The brig Consuelo was to have sailed from Mahukoua for San Francisco last night with a full cargo of sugar.

Tomorrow, high tide large 2.25 p.m.; high tide small 1.35 a.m.; low tide large 6.50 p.m.; low tide small 9.40 a.m.

The bark Anne Johnson was at Hilo, and the brig Consuelo at Mahukoua, when the Kinau left the "Big Island."

Onomae sugar was stowed in the hold of the Hawaiian bark Iolani at Kinau wharf today. She is loading for New York.

The British bark Belmont sails this afternoon for New York with 3579 bags sugar. Captain Ladd took a boat-load of bananas, watermelons, and fresh vegetables aboard yesterday.

Wilder Steamship Co.'s steamer Kinau arrived yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock from Hawaii and Maui. Besides a large cargo of sugar, potatoes, corn, wool, hides, livestock and sundries, she brought 76 cabin and 171 deck passengers. Nine passengers were from the volcano.
