GENERAL FOREIGN NEWS.

The Monroe Doctrine Not to be Recognized.

NEW YORK, May 19.—The Herald has the following from Managua: It is learned that Admiral Stephenson and other officers of the British squadron which invested Corinto, both before and after the occupation, publicly declared to a party of Americans that the Monroe doctrine was a myth which the United States would not and could not enforce, and that the British occupation of Corinto was simply a test to definitely dispose of that question.

Items of Interest.

Italy has been visited by a severe earthquake in which 3000 houses were damaged. The city of Florence was the center of the disturbance.

Admiral Kirkland has made an official report to the Washington authorities which largely discredits the Armenian atrocities.

LATE COAST NEWS.

The Australia Arrives at 2 P. M. The Income Tax Not Valid.

WASHINGTON, May 20.—The income tax law which has received so large a share of the public attention since the beginning of the regular session of the Fifty-Third Congress is a thing of the past. After being twice heard by the United States Supreme Court it was finally decided to-day by the Court to be invalid and unconstitutional.

WASHINGTON, May 20.—The President has signed the order directing Admiral Meade to be retired. The parting was made as unpleasant as possible by the President in a letter to the Admiral.

CLEVELAND, O., May 20.—One hundred and twenty-five lumber shovers are on strike in a saw mill here, and in their attempt to prevent the loading of the steamer a fight occurred. One man was severely beaten.

William Blaisdell, formerly manager of the Makee Sugar Co. returned to the islands to-day.

CHICAGO, May 17.—July wheat reached 70¢ on the Board of Trade to-day, 2 cents over the figures of last night, and closed at 70½ cents, the quotations being the highest since May, 1893.

CHICAGO, May 20.—At a meeting of Theosophists held here last night a new branch was formed. It will be called the Loyalty branch, and it is claimed by those interested that it will take the place of that section that has been known as the Chicago branch.

CHICAGO, May 17.—"Mad Henry" Manning a lunatic has been worry mothers and nursemaids in Chicago and the police are having a lively chase after him. He is credited with abducting four children within the past forty-eight hours.

SAN JOSE, Cal., May 20.—The funeral of Peter H. Burnett, first Governor of California, took place to-day.

ST. PAUL, Minn., May 20.—Gov. Clough to-day signed the death warrant for Henry Hayword, convicted of inciting and planning the murder of Catharine Ging of Minneapolis. The 21st of June is the day set for the execution.

THE JAPANESE WIN.

And Formosa is To Be Surrendered.

WASHINGTON, May 19.—The latest budget of mail received at the Japanese, Chinese and Korean Legations at Washington give much space to the changed conditions resulting from the war. Lord Li, son of Li Hung Chang, is expected to be the new Chinese Minister to Japan. The peace settlement will soon be followed by a restoration of diplomatic relations. Mr. Otori, now a member of the Japanese Privy Council, is mentioned as a probably Minister to China. He was formerly a Minister to China and knows the country thoroughly.

LONDON, May 19.—The Times tomorrow will publish a dispatch from Tien-tsin which says that Li Tien Fang, son of Li Hung Chang, has been appointed a committee to hand over the island of Formosa to Japan.

THE MIOWERA.

She is Safe and on Her Way Here.

The Australia brought the welcome news of the safety of the Miowera. The vessel met with an accident on her way up which detained her several days. She is now on her way here and if rumor says truly, she will be here to-morrow. Inquiry was made at the office of Theo. H. Davies & Co. at 3 p. m., but as that firm had not yet received its mail they had no definite news to give out.
