### A HORSE WHIPPING.

#### Detective Allen Gets a Trouncing - Mrs. Gauld Wields the Whip.

Mrs. Gauld, agent for the Viavi remedies here learning that Detective Allen had been using her name in a rather loose manner, applied a horse whip to that individual yesterday evening about 6 o'clock.

The attack was made on King street near Alakea, and was witnessed by a large number of persons whose sympathies were evidently on the side of Mrs. Gauld. Allen received several cuts across his face before he managed to get away from the infuriated woman.

In an interview with the lady she stated to a reporter for the BULLETIN that she had occasion, while Allen roomed at her house, to take him to task for speaking disrespectfully of her in the presence of her friends, and for which he apologized and promised not to repeat. After this Allen left her house taking a room in some other part of the city. Lately she has been told of remarks he has made reflecting upon her character and she decided to call him down in a manner which would at least convince him of her earnestness in the matter.

Accordingly at half-past five she armed herself with a short cowhide which she fastened around her right wrist and started after Allen whom she found emerging from Jun Hee's restaurant on King street. Mrs. Gauld stepped before him and slashed him across the face three or four times with the whip. Allen then made a pass at her but, she says, did not strike her, he then grabbed her whip hand and held on. Mrs. Gauld then struck him twice with her left hand when Officer Cordes, who was with Allen, interfered, and threatened to arrest Mrs. Gauld. This angered some of the by-standers and one of them struck Allen in the face. On finding the sympathies of the crowd were against him Allen retreated and Mrs. Gauld rode off on her bicycle.

A friend of Allen called at the BULLETIN office to say that Allen would probably prosecute Mrs. Gauld in the Police Court, and she says if he does she will convince Mr. Allen that the "new woman" has arrived and does not need the assistance of the law in asserting her rights.

A penal summons was issued from the Marshal's Office this morning, on complaint of Allen, charging Mrs. Gauld with assault and battery. A penal summons does not carry with it a warrant of arrest but simply notifies the defendant to appear before the court upon demand.

### The Late Edward Mrs Ward.

The decease of this gentleman awakes many memories among those who, like him early in life, cast their fates and fortunes in Australasia.

He had long and varied experience. Was a valued, honored, and trusted servant of the crown, both in Australia and New Zealand, for many years. He brought to all his duties, whether that of magistrate, counsel, judge in bankruptcy or registrar of the Supreme Court, a geniality and a kindliness of purpose, together with a singleness of aim which won admiration from Bench and Bar.

During his thirteen years' residence here, he was very unobtrusive and of retiring disposition, and none but his intimates knew the wealth of soul, goodness of heart, and before all his sterling uncompromising integrity.

Born in 1830 in Lancashire, England, he early chose law his profession, and was admitted in 1851. For four years he was a commissioned officer of the 5th Royal Lancashire Militia, only sending in his papers when he with many more embarked for the then El Dorado of the world. Prior to that time he had married Elizabeth, daughter of Donald Mackay of Drumnadrochit Inverness, Scotland, and he leaves issue two sons and an accomplished daughter living in Christchurch, N. Z.

He was a member of the English Victorian, New South Wales, New Zealand, California, and Hawaiian Bars. Here he rarely practised.

Mr. Livesay DeLeyland Ward, so well-known here in social and boating circles, is his youngest son. Mrs. Ward survives her husband, and the BULLETIN extends to her and the family hearty sympathy. The funeral will take place tomorrow at 10 a. m. from the family residence, Nuuanu street.
