JAPANESE HONOR MAN WHO SAVED A LIFE

Dr. William F. James of the United States public health and marine hospital service received quite a surprise yesterday when he was waited upon by a delegation of the Japanese hotel union of this city, headed by S. Sheba, editor of the Hawaii Shippo, and presented with a beautiful Japanese jardiniere and stand. He was also handed a letter explaining the visit and the cause of the presentation. The letter read as follows:

Honolulu, T. H., Oct. 2, 1912.

Dr. William F. James, United States Public Health and Marine Hospital Service, Honolulu.

Dear Sir—Voicing the unanimous sentiment of the Japanese community, the members of the Japanese Hotel Union of Honolulu desire to express their deep appreciation of the heroic act by which a Japanese woman, Sei Shibata, was saved by you from drowning in Honolulu harbor on the 22nd of September, 1912.
