MAUI FUSION ROW IS PATCHED UP

Noa W. Aluli Forced Off Ticket to Make Room for Nawahine.

WAILUKU, October 8.—Since the announcement that Noa W. Aluli has signed the Home Rule roll and was to get on the ticket in place of Noa Kupau, withdrawn, the Democratic wing of the fusionists has expressed some dissatisfaction, to ally which the Home Rule wing was finally forced to compel its new convert, Noa W. Aluli, to withdraw from running in place of Noa Kupau, who, it is claimed, withdrew in favor of R. J. K. Nawahine, the Waihee Democrat.

With the withdrawal of Mr. Aluli the threatened breach among the fusion politicians has been averted and harmony once more reigns.

Today the Democratic leaders announced that R. J. K. Nawahine is the regular fusion nominee for representative on their ticket, in place of Noa Kupau, claimed by them to have dropped out of the race, although telephonic reports from Hana are to the effect that Noa Kupau is still running on the ticket as originally made up.

Prince Kuhio arrived last night, accompanied by S. L. Desha. On arrival here Prince Kuhio changed the program mapped out for him and will make a speech-making campaign through central Maui. This afternoon the Prince will speak at Waiehu and tonight in Wailuku on Market street. The posters are out, and the local party workers expect to get out a big crowd for the speech-making, weather permitting.

Tomorrow the Delegate will go to Kula and other places in the Makawao district, accompanied by a few of the local candidates and political leaders.

Tearful Willie Coelho has returned. Coelho's long stay in Honolulu has created an impression among some of his followers that the Tearful One was having a case of cold feet, but his return is proof of the fact that he has gotten over it and will really make the independent campaign as he threatened to. The total of registered voters for the county of Maui at three p. m. today has reached 2495, which is over ninety less than the registered number of voters two years ago.

WATERS OUT AFTER MORE FRAUD EVIDENCE

SAN FRANCISCO, October 1.—That H. H. Waters, who, it has been stated, was out here merely to make a perfunctory examination of the sugar duties paid to Uncle Sam, is in reality bent upon uncovering further frauds on the part of the sugar trust and bribed customs inspectors in New York, is the rumor which leaked out yesterday about the local customhouse.

The quality of sugar imported into the United States is separated into grades, each of which is charged a specified duty. The quality of the sugar is determined by means of polariscope tests.

It is rumored that the government authorities have been informed that the bribed New York inspectors, in addition to robbing the government of millions of dollars by means of false scales, graded all sugar of the trust below its actual quality.

For the purpose of probing this, it is said, Waters is being sent to every port of the United States to compare the quality ratings of the respective sugar exporting countries in the books of each port visited and those of the New York customhouse.

Waters has been selected for the investigation because of his excellent work in unearthing the frauds in New York city.

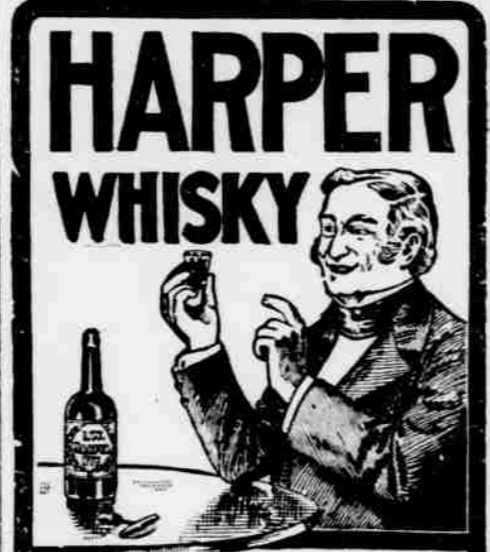
