THE LAST SAD RITES.

The late Capt. George Gedge was buried Wednesday afternoon by Naval lodge, No. 87, F. and A. M., from the hall on Virginia street. The attendance was very large, many who desired to gain admittance to the hall being unable to do so. Admiral Irwin and other officers of the navy yard were in attendance, as were also many relatives and friends from elsewhere, including Col. A. Powell, Capt. Pool of the Piedmont, A. S. Carman and R. A.

Williams, formerly of the navy. The floral pieces were as numerous and as beautiful as we have ever seen at a funeral in Vallejo and the designs included anchors, pilot wheels, etc. Appropriate music was furnished by a quartet consisting of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Breed, Miss Anna Cassady and Prof. Green. Rev. Joseph Hamilton made a few suitable remarks dwelling upon the noble traits and exemplary character of the deceased, and cautioning all to live well that they may die well. Then the brethren of the mystic tie, G. A. Bergwall worthy master, performed their solemn and beautiful rites. A very large procession of the people sorrowfully followed the body to Union Cemetery, where it was placed in the receiving vault. The pall-bearers were; Geo. Rounds, James Topley, H. D. Lazelle, C. [Captain George Gedge, son of the late Admiral John Gedge of the royal navy, was born at Yarmouth, England, on the 18th of January, 1819. His elder brother, John Gedge, followed his father's profession and became a commander in the royal navy at an early age, but subsequently resigned and settled in New Orleans, soon becoming chief justice of the supreme court of Louisiana and grand master of the grand lodge of Masons. George Gedge became identified with the profession of his father and after brilliant success was, before he reached his majority, in command of a large troop ship on duty among the Australia colonies. While the East India company's naval service was at the height of its proficiency, Captain Gedge held 71 Hotel St. a captain's commission at an early age and saw much active service both in India and afterwards in China during the rebellion and bravely maintained the reputation of his illustrious father. His life in Australia and subsequently in New Zealand, where for a long time he was held a prisoner among the romances. He came to California early in the forties and was more or less associated with mercantile and mining matters for many years,
