Meanwhile, as it dawns upon the people just how much actual justice is intended by the sugar party to civilization and humanity, their sensations will probably be like those of the man who, stepping up to the village drunk to congratulate him upon donning the blue ribbon at last, is compelled by the combined odor of cloves and gin that greets him, to admit that the village has not lost its same old "six pence" yet.
