MORMON CHIEF SAILS TO COAST ON ALAMEDA

The Oceanic wharf was crowded this morning by interested Honoluluans to see relatives and friends depart in the Alameda, which sailed at 10 o'clock.

The Alameda took a large number of passengers, who came down in her on the last trip. There were fifty-six, including thirty-eight in the steerage. Among the cabin passengers was President Smith of the Mormon Church.

MEETING TO DISCUSS THE LIQUOR BILL

A session of the Finance Committee of the House was held last night for the purpose of considering the Liquor Bill. A number of the members of the Liquor Dealers' Association were present, and were accompanied by their attorney, E. C. Peters, who presented to the committee the liquor men's view of the matter.

He stated that the bill as amended does not take away from the Territory any of its present power to control the liquor business, the only amendment being that giving the right of appeal from decisions of the License Board to a Circuit Judge in chambers. The only effect of this amendment, he said, would be to limit the arbitrary power of the chairman of the Commission so that he could not act entirely according to his own likes and dislikes or through personal prejudice.
