## WILL BUY KIHAI STOCK TOMORROW

Tomorrow is the great day which has been set for the purchase of the stocks of the Kihai Sugar Company, and the agents, Alexander & Baldwin, expect a great rush of the stockholders, of which there are about 14,000 dred altogether. Tomorrow the stock certificates will be received and receipts given for them. Tomorrow night the bookkeepers of the concern will burn the midnight oil making out the checks good for cash, paying for the certificates which have been turned in, and on the following day these will be tendered to the owners of the certificates. While it is expected that the majority of the stockholders will turn up tomorrow, it is probable that a great number, especially those who live on the other islands, will send theirs in later.

## HACKFELD ONLY BIDDER

Cement bids for work at Pearl Harbor opened at noon today at the office of U. S. Engineer Captain Otwell, showed only one bid, from H. Hackfeld & Co., Ltd. Their bid is for Portland cement, delivered at the wharf in Honolulu in bags, \$2.31 bbl., and delivered at Halawa wharf in bags 2.45 bbl., with a rebate in each case for return of bags.
