Weapons of Warfare
Used by Old Hawaiians

The old Hawaiians were very clever in making various kinds of weapons. They made a weapon which is like a bleeder and it was made out of whale's rib and on one side of it were placed two shark teeth. This weapon was used for secret attack. It could be easily hidden under their kiel and when there was a good time for cutting they would draw it across the enemy's bowels and rip him open.

There was another one which was fastened on to the finger and it was used in the same way. It was made out of a shark's tooth and the handle was made of kaulla and the ring which fastened on to the finger was a very strong cord. There were other kinds of weapons which are the daggers. There are three of these daggers in the Museum now and they are the only ones that are known. They were made of a very strong and heavy kind of wood which is the kaulla. These daggers were made differently from each other and they were made so that when they were thrust into the body and pulled out again they would catch hold of the flesh or bowels and tear them open. The points of these daggers look blunt but when it is thrust into a man it would pierce clean through his body. These weapons were used in war mostly. The Hawaiian's name for these bleeders as we would call them was Lelomano. There is also another one belonging to the Lelomano set and it is made of kaulla and a shark's tooth. They also had strangling cords. A man known as a Mu would go around and pick out a victim to be sacrificed and would lasso him. Before the poor victim knew anything he was in the hands of the Mu. These strangling cords were made of a whale's tooth and a strong cord made out of olona. They also had slings which were made out of hau fiber and the stones were egg shape. These stones were not naturally got that way, but ground down into that shape. There are eleven of these stones which are now in the Museum, and they were found on the Kamehameha School grounds by a Portuguese man who was blasting rocks there. Their clubs were made of kaulla and the shape of them is peculiar. They are not like our clubs we have now, but were shaped like a large tent peg.—Ululani Lemon in the Blue and White.
