Kahului Shipping.

Waikuku, Dec. 29.—The Wilder's S. S. Co.'s new steamer Kaulani, Captain Jacobsen, arrived at Kahului last Thursday after a smart run of nine days from the Golden Gate with a full cargo of general merchandise; no passengers.

After unloading cargo next week, the Kaulani will proceed to Honolulu to get an Hawaiian registry, as she is now flying the American flag.

The Kaulani is a wooden steamer of 223 tons register and is constructed after the model of the steamer Hawaii.

The American schooner Meta Nelson arrived at Kihel today with a full cargo of lumber for the Kihel Plantation Co. Her captain will come over to Kahului next Tuesday to enter his vessel so as to get a permit to discharge.

The bark D. E. Sander left today in ballast for Port Townsend.

The surveyship Pathfinder will leave next week for Hilo.
