## CITY FATHERS FACE DEPLETED TREASURY AS NEW WORK IS MOOTED

The city and county officers present a depleted appearance as constant demands are made for funds to carry forward proposed improvements. Queen street from its intersection with Nimitz street and extending to Water street is to be widened by a foot of business men to be the worst thoroughfare in the city of Honolulu. A monster petition for an increase in the tax of Mayor J. J. Bern, which is made that the road money leading from the highways to the city and county road district be increased. Engineer Whitcomb gave the city fathers a detailed check when the estimate of \$2,200,000 was presented. It is stated that it will require this sum to pave the street with a suitable material. According to the petitioners, Queen street is one of the roads subjected to the severest wear and that 75 per cent of the business traffic went over that thoroughfare, and it was one of the worst streets in the city. All the driving from the Harbor and Honolulu wharves and the entire driving to and from the hotel and other business concerns over that road. Queen street between Fort and Nimitz is already paved with cemented blocks. The matter was referred to the ways and means committee to provide funds. The committee has finally adopted a plan whereby the city will expend \$2,000,000 of its appropriation of \$2,000,000 for the widening of Hotel street. After narrowing down the estimate by a list of property owners, tenants, and other claimants, the figures for widening the street near its intersection with Fort street are now fixed at approximately \$12,000. A specially appointed board of arbitration, including Messrs. L. M. Whitehouse, Fred Harrison and John Linn, submitted a report listing the reconstruction of the Honolulu building, \$10,000; Damon building, \$12,500. As to the remainder of the expansion, the supervisor summoned them up briefly as follows: Damon building and needed for widening, \$10,000; reconstruction of building, \$12,500; H. O'Brien settlement, \$12,500; rent of O'Brien's quarters, \$200; total, \$15,500. Honolulu building, \$15,000; West building, \$22,500; How Kyoung's, \$12,500; land for widening, \$10,000; reconstruction, \$10,000; rents, etc., \$10,000; \$22,500; making a grand total of \$11,012.50. Supervisor Low, who has been absent from the city for the month past, was inclined to denounce the report. He refused to vote for the general appropriation, while Dwight took the stand that in the matter of assessing betterments the city was not getting the best end of the deal.
