SHALL JAPANESE BE TAKEN BY Y. M. C. A.?

(Continued from Page 1.)

would have to draw the line at the Japanese, or it would be flooded with Orientals.

The gravity of the matter became apparent when the directors and prominent members of the association began to fear that the barring of the eleven consul might be considered offensive by the consulate and the Japanese colony as well. Consequently, it was decided to allow a time to think it over. General Secretary Super is clearly against the admission of Japanese, judging from his conversation. It is pointed out that there is a local Japanese Y. M. C. A., and that Mr. Mori's sphere of usefulness could be rolled along there.

An important precedent is about to be set by the Y. M. C. A. This morning a reporter for the Bulletin was refused information about the incident by Secretary Super of the association. Mr. Super would not even divulge the names of the membership committee, although this is a matter of public record. He would not give the names of the directors present last night.

It was decided later, however, that publicity on the plain facts about the affair would be better for all concerned than garbled and exaggerated reports that gained currency.

CHARGE ON THE LIGHT BRIGADE

A charge on the "light brigade" was indicated at an early hour this morning by R. E. Hart, who told the police that he was connected with the Fifth Cavalry, stationed at Lihouha.

Hart came to town last evening and the officers insist that he became much under the influence of those liquors from which plebsicles emanate only to pierce a liberty-loving people.

A number of men belonging to the lighthouse service and also the Federal coast and geodetic survey steamer Explorer ran about the course set by Hart in his cruise down a deserted and quiescent Fort street. Squalls immediately appeared off the horizon and there is said to have been the expenditure of much sulphurous conversation during the altercation that followed.

Although Hart was backed up by legal counsel, Judge Lymer considered that the law had been outraged to the tune of at least fifteen dollars and the costs, which sum was assessed the defendant.
