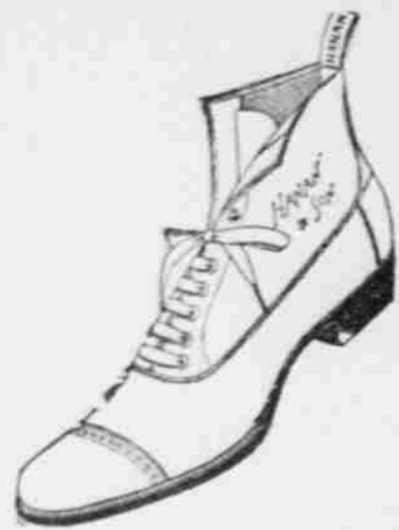

## SUIT FOR LANDS AT KOOLAULOA

### Isaac Testa Says Property In Kapaka Is His By Right of Law.

#### FIRM OF YET CHONG IS BANKRUPT

#### ARCHIBALD GILFILLAN'S WILL NAMES CECIL BROWN AS EXECUTOR.

#### Demurrers of Lucas Minors—Sister Albertina Ejection Case—Notices of Appeal—Pain Makes Answer—George Markham's General Denial—New Term of Court.

By his attorneys, Smith & Lewis, Isaac Testa brings suit in the First Circuit Court against H. Kaulahilo, John F. Colburn, executor of the will of Antone Rosa, deceased; Helen A. Rosa, guardian of William Ladd Rosa, Mahelani Rosa and Rose Rosa, minors, for the declaration of trust, the appointment of trustee and conveyance of real estate.

The complaint alleges that on August 29, 1888, the defendant, a resident of Kapaka, Koolauloa, possessed certain lands at that place which he delivered to Testa by mortgage by way of securing the payment of a promissory note and that when the note became due no money was forthcoming and steps were taken to foreclose the mortgage. Rosa bid in all the land involved when the place was sold at auction.

When Rosa died he had possession of all the papers in the case and the plaintiff believes that the foreclosure proceedings were not completed, in that, after the sale of the land, no deed or other conveyance of the premises was ever made by him as mortgagee. J. F. Colburn was appointed executor of the will of Antone Rosa and was appointed guardian of the minors on the same date. Plaintiff asks for the appointment of a suitable person to succeed Antone Rosa, deceased, as trustee.

#### In the Federal Court.

United States Judge Estee yesterday morning adjudicated bankrupt Chew Man, together with five other Chinese, who carry on business under the firm name of Yet Chong, at Aala lane, in this city, the petition of the bankrupts declaring that they owe debts which they cannot pay. They say that they are willing to hand over all their property for the benefit of their creditors, except what is exempted by law, desiring to obtain the benefit of the United States bankruptcy laws.

Their assets consist chiefly of goods in the possession of the High Sheriff, taken by execution and amounting to \$50 00 in value. There are no secured creditors. Unsecured debts are shown as amounting to \$1560.86 and debts to be paid in full \$212.90. Among the debts are fifteen small promissory notes. The following are a few of the debtors: Ah Shin, one arm, \$40; native, \$2.80; white man, mason, \$3.00; half white, carpenter, \$1.25; mason, Portuguese, \$8.40; Jap (cook), \$2.75; water boss, \$3.50; Dole, \$4.00; mill hand, \$2.60; water pump, \$3.00; blacksmith, Portuguese, \$2.70; No. 5 pump, \$2.00.

#### Pearl Harbor Land Valued.

In the matter of the appeal for a new trial of the Honolulu Plantation Company, the brief of United States District Attorney J. J. Dunne, which has been delivered to Judge Silliman, representing defendants, declares that the jury went outside of the evidence in placing a valuation of \$15,208 on the improvements on the land in question.

Judge Silliman yesterday afternoon handed his brief, in reply, to Mr. Dunne.

The following, in part, is Mr. Dunne's brief:

- "1. The 561 acres never had any annual use.
- "2. They never had a yearly value.
- "3. They had never been cleared, plowed, sowed or cropped.
- "4. Nearly one-half is useless and unfit for cultivation.
- "5. They never produced any income whatever.
- "6. The whole piece is raw land that never has been cultivated, that never raised a crop, and whose capabilities are purely speculative.
- "7. Shallow soil, rocky patches, weedy spots.
- "8. No water supply beyond one small brackish artesian well.
- "9. Railroad easement.
- "10. No improvements. Neither the mill nor the pumping plant is on this land. They are both independent, and built prior to the clearing and ploughing. They would have been built anyway, whether the defendant got this land or not, as they were both indispensable to the other 561 acres of the plantation.
- "11. Until recently this land was a waste, overrun by cattle. It was not subjected to any useful purpose,

whether for transportation, storage, repair shop, or other purposes or as a living ground for employees.

"12. These 561 acres never had any influence, whether for good or bad, upon the remainder of the plantation. They neither produced nor contributed anything to the annual use of the plantation.

"13. Even on the assumption that these acres are as good as the rest, the Dowsett lease transaction shows that \$28.40 per acre is a fair valuation upon defendant's own conduct and judgment in the purchase of that lease."

#### Demurrer of A. H. Lucas.

Albert H. Lucas, one of the defendants in the equity case of Samuel C. Allen against Thomas R. Lucas et al, by his guardian ad litem, J. J. Dunne demurs to the plaintiff's complaint, alleging that the complaint fails to state sufficient facts to constitute cause of action and that it is ambiguous, unintelligible and uncertain.

Thomas R. Lucas, Jr., Lydia C. Lucas, minor, defendants in the above case, by their guardian ad litem, E. M. Watson, also demurs to the plaintiff's complaint on the same grounds given in the demurrer of Albert H. Lucas. The case is a bill for foreclosure of mortgage.

#### Gilfillan's Will.

Petition for probate of the will of the late Archibald F. Gilfillan has been filed. Cecil Brown is named as executor. The deceased died in Philadelphia on December 23, 1901, leaving an estate in this Territory as follows: Two lots situate at Kulaokahoa, baseball tract, Honolulu, and property in San Francisco valued at about \$3000. Personal estate consists of stocks and money in hand valued at \$8000.

Mabel Phillips of Honolulu and James C. Gilfillan of San Francisco are named as devisees and legatees. Petition has been set for hearing on Monday, March 3.

#### Estate of G. J. Rocio.

Final account of J. S. Azevedo, executor of the will of J. Rocio, filed yesterday, shows a balance on hand of \$364.18. Monday, March 3, has been appointed as the time for hearing the petition for allowance of accounts, final distribution and discharge.

#### Ejection Case.

Summons was yesterday returned as served in the case of Sister Albertina, trustee for Stella Cockett, against J. Kaalima et al, ejection. Sister Albertina complains that defendants have unjustly taken into their possession a piece of land at Waikale, about 1 25-100 acres, which plaintiff claims in fee simple by descent purchase and otherwise to the damage of plaintiff \$156.25.

#### Notice of Appeal.

Notice of appeal, certificate and record from Second District Magistrate of Honolulu has been filed in the case of Allen & Robinson, Limited, against Tam San, Fu Lee and Ah Tom, for alleged indebtedness.

#### To Hear Demurrer.

In the case of Paulo Lono against Julia Achien, bill to set aside and cancel deed, complainant makes motion that the demurrer of respondent be set for hearing. Andrews, Peter & Andrade for plaintiff.

#### Pain Makes Answer.

Answer has been filed in the case of George W. Hayselden against the Hawaiian Tramways Company, Limited, trespass on a case, the defendant by Holmes & Stanley, denying all allegations in the complaint.

#### Petition Granted.

Petition for an order to discharge, in the matter of the guardianship of Kahana, now of legal majority, has been granted and Henry Smith, guardian, was yesterday ordered to pay to Kahana \$168.

#### Guardian's Bond.

In the matter of the guardianship of Joshua David Koki a minor, Theresa Aiu Koki, principal, and Thomas Aiu and S. D. Koki, sureties, have filed a bond in the sum of \$7,000. Theresa Koki is appointed guardian.

#### Defendants' Appeal.

Defendants in the assumpt case of Lee Kow against Lee Chan and Yang Jan give notice of appeal from the Second District Magistrate of Honolulu, filing bond for costs.

#### George Markham's Answer.

Defendants George Markham et al, make answer of general denial in the action to quiet title brought by Pelew. Joseph M. Porpoie is attorney for the defendants.

#### New Term of Court.

The new term of the First Circuit Court will commence a week from Monday. Venues for a grand and a petit jury will be issued within a few days for service. Both Judge Humphreys and Judge Gear, who is expected back from the Coast on the Ventura, will hold court.

#### Notary Public Kellert.

P. D. Kellert was yesterday commissioned to act as notary public for the First Judicial Circuit.

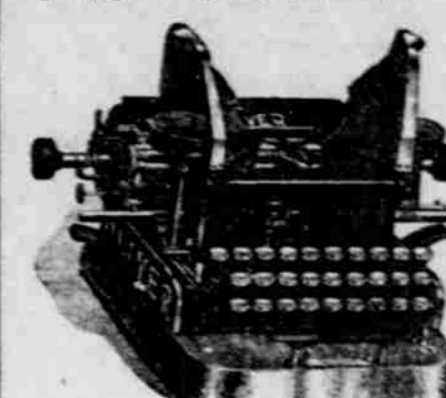
