A Relic of Barbarism.

The president of the United States, as chief marshal thereof, through United States Marshal Glen Miller, as proxy or deputy, got upon the trail of the City of Ogden Saturday. Ogden was rounded up, served with a writ, acknowledged the same and promised to be in court when wanted under penalty of facing contempt proceedings.

It is a custom of the federal court not generally understood by the public to issue subpoenas and other papers in the name of the president as chief marshal. Personal service is necessary, and as no deviation from the rule is made in cases where municipalities and corporations are involved, some strange appearing documents are the result.

Consequent to the action begun by the Ogden Waterworks company against the city of Ogden on Friday, it became necessary to serve a writ upon Ogden. Following is a brief excerpt from the paper turned over to Marshal Miller by Clerk Jerrold Letcher when he set upon his journey:

"The President of the United States to Ogden City. Greeting:

"You are hereby commanded that you personally be and appear before the judges of the circuit court of the United States for the district of Utah, at the building used as the United States court house, in the city of Salt Lake, in said district, upon the first Monday of November and answer to a bill in equity filed and exhibited against you in said court."

Upon reaching Ogden Glen Miller called loudly. "Hear ye! Hear ye! Hear ye! The city of Ogden is called upon to step forward and be subpoenaed!"

Receiving no response other than the echo of his own voice, he sought out Mayor N. S. Browning, who in a case of this kind can be legally regarded as Ogden, and the writ was served. The case will be bitterly contested by both sides, it is said, and will result in an interesting fight.—Salt Lake Herald.
