U. S. NEEDS MEN FOR CONSTRUCTION WORK.

Hundreds of transients, levelmen, rodmen, chainmen and draftsmen (salaries \$1800 to \$3000 per annum) are urgently needed by the Construction Division of the United States Army for work on the three hundred projects (costing \$500,000,000) now in the course of construction.

These projects are camps, cantonments, arsenals, wards, docks, great port terminals, reserve stores, warehouses, embarkation camps, engineering camps, gunnery schools, housing, lighters, power plants, factories, and additions to manufacturing plants.

To give some idea of the size of the size of these projects, the Construction Division of the Army advises that the amount of lumber ordered would cover 22,000 acres or 34 square miles; needing in addition 2,000,000 doors, 25,000,000 feet of roofing.

As many as 19,000 workmen are employed on a single project. 25,000 workmen have been under the control of the division at one time. All qualified persons are urged to make immediate inquiry relative to the above mentioned positions at the office of the District Secretary, Eleventh U. S. Civil Service District, 303 Post Office Building, Seattle, Wash.

I have been nominated at the late Primary Election as a candidate for the position of Judge of the Fifth Judicial District of Idaho. About 600 of my friends that enough of my qualifications for this high office to go to the trouble of writing my name on the primary ballot and voting for me. For this compliment I wish to express my hearty thanks and appreciation.

As the office for which I am a candidate is non-political, and all meetings are forbidden, I take this method of introducing myself to the voters of the District and soliciting your suffrages regardless of party lines.

I am 36 years of age and for many years a resident freeholder and taxpayer of Oneida County, but for the last year, with my family, a resident of Preston, Idaho. I am a member of the law firm of Davis & Evans, with offices at Malad and Preston, and for many years past have been successfully engaged in the practice of law in this district.

My education has been obtained by burning the midnight oil, and by an extended course in the University of Hard-Knocks, commencing at the age of 12 years in the coal mines. Since then I have had courses in this state as a miner, lumberman, farmer, school teacher and merchant, winding up with a course in the law department of the University of Idaho.

I believe in the right of all classes of the community to organize for their own protection. My experience in these various lines of work has given me a practical understanding of the conditions confronting all classes of citizens that would be invaluable in the administration of justice.

I believe that the law should be so administered as to secure justice tempered with mercy, and that the courts should aim to reform the wrongdoer rather than merely to punish him.

Each voter may vote for TWO judges in this district on the 6th of November, and I bespeak ONE vote from EACH voter without distinction of party, for one of these offices. If elected I pledge myself to the honest, speedy and efficient administration of the duties of the office.

TO THE PEOPLE OF THE FIFTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

I have been nominated as candidate for District Judge of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Idaho, comprising the counties of Bannock, Bear Lake, Oneida, Franklin and Power. I have served as Judge in this District for the past four years. At the time I began my duties the dockets of the Court in the various counties were so crowded and congested, many of the cases having been on the docket for a long time, that it was impossible for two men to do this work. I claim that for three years of my service I did the work of two men, and did twice as much work as any man should do. By starting Court early in the morning and holding it until late at night I not only relieved the congestion to an appreciable degree, but by intelligent management of the Court affairs I saved the people of this District many thousands of dollars, and I would ask that you inquire of the county officials of your county, who are familiar with the court work, as to whether my statement is true or not. The population of this Judicial District is more than one hundred thousand, and there are more than twenty thousand voters scattered over a wide area, so that if I had nothing else to do it would be impossible for me to meet but a small percentage of the voters between now and election day. Any person acting as Judge of such a large District for four years necessarily creates enemies, as certain litigants, both civil and criminal, are dissatisfied with the rulings of the Judge, and many of these look forward to election day as the time that they can get even for the grievances, but I trust that the voter will remember that when I passed on a case I heard both sides of it, but you will only be told one.

I shall rely upon my four years' record as Judge of this District to secure my re-election.
