#### Needed Reforms

EDITOR EXAMINER:  
The members elect to the legislature from this county feel they have been honored by their constituents, and realize the people expect their best efforts to secure such legislation as will grant needed relief in matters affecting their welfare and prosperity. Chief among the reforms expected, in state and county affairs, are reduction in excessive fees and salaries, to a reasonable basis, that the burdens of taxation may be lessened and exorbitant public expenditures made impossible under the law. The next greatest question that ought to be settled is that of the preservation of our ranges and the taxing of the transient horses, cattle and sheep that are now dumped upon our ranges from all the surrounding states. Thousands of head, and from which we hitherto have absolutely received neither revenue nor protection. I understand Utah, Nevada and Wyoming have laws governing in these matters, while our state has nothing to prevent our public domain, from our door yards to our mountain tops from being a public foraging ground for all comers and a camp of desolation to the actual settler. I know of no question concerning the prosperity of our people and that of the state of more paramount importance than this subject. Our public domain is the joint property of the state and general government and great care will have to be taken in farming a bill that will stand the legal battles that will be waged upon it by the pirates of our ranges, hence the legislature will undoubtedly bring to their aid the best legal talent obtainable in safely legislation on this matter. Self preservation demands a settlement and I believe the legislature will settle it. I would therefore suggest to the leading men of every precinct in Bear Lake county to immediately draw up petitions to the legislature covering these points, and have them signed as unanimously as possible, and ready to forward your members in the legislature early in the session, and I think all the counties will cooperate in this action and your representatives will do all in their power to secure the needed relief. Care should be taken in drawing the petitions to cover the general term "Stock, not sheep alone as the legislature is prohibited from the enactment of special legislation.  
If the members from Bear Lake

county can have their way they will elect a United States senator on the first ballot secure the legislation as indicated or on those lines, adjourn and come home.
