PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF
COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

January 21, 1919.
Board met pursuant to adjournment of yesterday present same as yesterday. Minutes of yesterday read and approved, whereupon the board proceeded to business as follows:
On application of eter Aschenbrenner is hereby appointed a justice of the peace of Ferdinand precinct. Bond to be furnished in the sum of \$500.
It appearing to the board that there is a balance to the credit of the Personal Property Tax Fund for which there is no further need in said fund, therefore it is hereby ordered that said balance, amounting to \$298.30, be transferred to the Current Expense Fund and the county auditor and county treasurer are hereby instructed to make such entries in the accounts of their books as will show such transfer.

In accordance with section 894, page 162 of the 1911 Session Laws, a road

pol itax is hereby levied for highway purposes upon each and every adult male person within the county including persons within unincorporated cities, towns and villages, same to be paid into the Road Fund of the county; it is further ordered that it is the duty of the overseers of the various road districts to collect such tax.

Report of B. L. Hussman, justice of the peace of Cottonwood precinct, examined and approved.

Report of county auditor, showing his settlement with the tax collector on the tax rolls of 1918, examined and accepted, said settlement herewith recorded at length to-wit:

Request of Margaret Sweet to be supplied with a new typewriter, hereby granted, and permission given her to apply the old typewriter now in the office on the price of the new.

In the matter of letting the contract for the county printing: It appearing that there is offered but one bid, that of the Globe Printing Co., and the same having been submitted in accordance with the schedule of the Printers of the Northwest, issued from Spokane, Wash. said schedule being made a part of the proposal and bid a said Globe Printing Co., the board here ordered that said bid be accepted, and that the Grangeville Globe is hereby designated the Official County Paper, and that the Globe Printing Co. and Idaho County, by its board of County Commissioners, enter into a contract in accordance with

said bid and proposal, and that a bond in the sum of \$1,000 be executed for the faithful performance of the contract entered into.

And it further appearing to the board that under the bid submitted considerable saving to the county will result if the county officials will cooperate with the board by ordering at least 500 copies of whatever piece of printing is ordered, and the board having consulted with the various county officials upon the matter and having explained the same fully and the various county officials having agreed to adhere to this plan and cooperate fully in the interests of economy, it is further ordered that orders given to the said printing company be in amounts of not less than 500 and that all supplies that can be purchased as reasonable in the county, and at prices that are in keeping with prices elsewhere should be purchased in the county, provided the service is as prompt as found elsewhere.

The action of the county auditor in disposing of an old typewriter for the

sum of \$25.00 is hereby ratified, and said amount is hereby ordered to be placed in the Current Expense fund.

Bond and contract of Dr. C. S. Stockton here examined and approved.

It is hereby ordered that an adjourned meeting of the board of county commissioners shall convene at 10 o'clock a. m. Feb. 10, 1919, for the purpose of acting upon the applications for such ferry franchises and licenses as may be laid before them at that time and for the further purpose of opening and acting upon proposals and bids for the repair of the LaBelle bridge crossing the Salmon river, and for the further purpose of executing the contract with the Globe Printing Co., above referred to, and to examine and pass upon the bond called for in said contract.

No business other than that designated will be entertained at such adjourned meeting.
