HOLD EXAMINATION FOR FOREST AND FIELD CLERKS

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that a forest and field clerk examination will be held in this city on July 16, 1919, to fill vacancies in the position of forest clerk, forest service, and clerk in the reclamation and other field services of the government service throughout the Eleventh civil service district (Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, and Alaska.) The entrance salary for the position of forest clerk is \$1100 or \$1200 a year; for the position of clerk in the reclamation and other services, \$1100 to \$1400 a year. Age limits for forest clerk, 18 to 40 years; for field clerk 18 years or over. Both men and women will be admitted to the examination.

Howell, passed: That the cooperative agreement covering the survey, construction and maintenance of the Montpelier, Idaho, Afton, Wyoming road project be approved, and that an appropriation of \$17,500 be made available for immediate use for the calendar year 1919. This resolution being signed by all members of the Board of County Commissioners.

In the matter of canceling delinquent tax sale certificates No. 109 for the year 1911, it appearing to the board that an error had been made in the assessment for said year it is hereby ordered that tax sale certificate No. 109 for \$38.30 be and is hereby ordered canceled.

In the matter of the application of Mrs. Margaret Wilson for a Widow's pension, it appearing to the board that good cause exists and that she is worthy, it is hereby ordered that she is allowed \$10.00 a month and the County Auditor is hereby ordered to draw in favor of Mrs. Margaret Wilson, his warrant for \$10.00

the first of each month until further notice.
