Rathdrum was a rain free from influenza Thursday, the two cases recently reported having recovered. No new cases have been reported since.

The stockholders of the Rathdrum Grain & Supply company met in special session Wednesday night and voted to increase the capital stock from \$5000 to \$15,000. Several liberal subscriptions of the new stock were taken at the meeting.

The artillery brigade of the 41st division, which includes the 146th in which Idaho men are serving, is now in Germany as a part of the army of occupation. Most of the rest of the 41st is scheduled for early return to America.

The service flag of Rathdrum camp, M. W. of A., contains eleven blue stars. It was received recently and hung on the wall in the lodge room. Rathdrum Camp will have installation of officers Jan. 18.

The Twentieth Century Reading circle met at the home of Mrs. H. A. Krueger Wednesday afternoon. During the business session several new members were received, and Mrs. Geo. V. Morris was elected president to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. F. O. Hill, who sent in her resignation. The circle will meet with Mrs. L. O. Swenson January 15.

The fourth installment (20 per cent) on Liberty bonds of the fourth issue should be paid on or before Jan. 13th, as they are due at San Francisco on the 16th. This applies to subscriptions made thru the Rathdrum State bank. If final payment is made at this time the interest accrued on deferred payments must be included in the remittance.

About 20 young people from Spirit Lake attended the roller skating at the armory in Rathdrum last Saturday and gave rise to fears that the influenza might again be spread to this community by such visitations, causing an order to be issued closing the rink. A dance that was to have been given New Year's eve, was cancelled in order to obviate this danger of contact with other communities where the influenza situation was serious.

OSCAR G. SHEFFIELD

The body of Oscar Sheffield, son of Mr. and Mrs. Grant Sheffield, arrived Tuesday from Newport News, Virginia, where he died of influenza-pneumonia while in the military service. The funeral, which was largely attended, was held from the Presbyterian church Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. J. G. Carrick officiating. The service included singing of "Nearer, My God, to Thee" and "Safe in the Arms of Jesus"; also a special, "Beyond the Shadows," by N. H. Taylor and Miss Carrick.

Oscar G. Sheffield was born Nov. 1, 1895, at Rathdrum, Idaho; died at Camp Stewart, Newport News, Va., Dec. 28, 1918, age 23 years, one month, 27 days.

He was called into the army service June 28, 1918, and went to Camp Lewis, from which he was transferred to Camp Fremont, Calif. He went from there to Camp Mills, New York, Oct. 22, and thence to Camp Stewart, where he contracted influenza which was followed by pneumonia and death.

The young soldier leaves his parents, one brother, Wm. J. Sheffield, and two sisters, Alice and Olive; also other relatives and many friends to mourn his death.

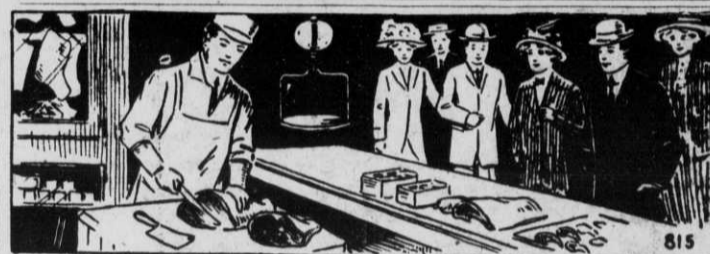
