WOULD AID POTATO SELLING

Potato Growers' Association Files Articles of Incorporation.

Sandpoint Review—The Bonner County Seed Potato Growers' association filed articles Wednesday with the county clerk. The articles give the association rights "to sell, transfer or pledge shares of capital stock or bonds in any corporation engaged in any relative activity," and "shall do everything possible to eliminate or minimize speculation and manipulation by speculators in marketing potatoes in the Pacific northwest," and "shall do everything within its power to secure the planting of the most desirable and profitable varieties of potatoes and to market the same as directly as possible to the consumers with the least possible waste due to extravagance or manipulated channels of trade."

The following members of the association filed the articles: H. F. Schedler, president; D. G. Francis, A. R. Frazer, G. M. Demfrey, C. W. Gresham, J. B. List, James S. Munroe, Albert T. Ullman, L. C. McPherson, C. A. Albee.

Handle Many Eggs

According to the records of Percy Neill, bookkeeper for the Kootenai Valley Produce Co., that concern has handled 8,467 dozen of eggs for Boundary county farmers in the past 11 months. No record was kept of eggs brought to the store and traded in for merchandise.

It is quite fair to assume that the other four grocery firms of Bonners Ferry handled at least 30,000 dozen eggs in the past 11 months, and that the rural stores handled another 20,000 dozen.

These figures do not account for the eggs consumed by families keeping a flock of chickens and so it is almost impossible to estimate the number of eggs which are produced annually in this district.

At any rate, the poultry business in Boundary county has proven profitable to many farmers and they are increasing their flocks every year. Local merchants state that the home market is not yet supplied by local eggs and that many hundred cases have to be shipped in each year.

TO TAKE PLACE OF CANVASSES

Salvation Army Drive Is for All Enterprises, Says Graves.

E. L. Graves, state campaign manager for Idaho for the Salvation Army drive in this state in which Boundary county has been assigned \$750 to raise, writes the Herald as follows: "These drives are being held annually in every county with the understanding that the people of the community will not be solicited from at any time during the year by any Salvationist unless they have the endorsement of the chamber of commerce and that is to be secured only upon request of the divisional commander for the state of Idaho. I mention this because it has been brought to my notice that on several occasions during the past year several attempts were made to solicit money without our knowledge."

Separate Forestry Offices

The headquarters of the Pend Oreille and Kanku forests, which were united a few years ago under direction of the office in Sandpoint, are to be separated in operation, according to word received by the Sandpoint forestry office from the forestry department at Washington, D. C.

National Forester Greeley has adopted a general policy for all forests looking to smaller units and the order comes in conformity with that announced policy.

The Kanku forest was operated formerly from Newport, Wash. It is not been determined whether the two forests will be operated from Sandpoint under different office forces or whether the order will result in the transfer of the office for the Kanku forest to Newport.

Dedham, Mass.—The hearing before Judge Webster Bayer of the supreme court on petitions for a new trial for Nicolo Sacco and Bartholomew Vanzetti was continued at the court house Saturday. Counsel for the men, who were convicted by a jury of murder in the first degree for a double killing in connection with a payroll robbery at South Braintree in April, 1920, resumed their arguments, begun last Saturday. Officers armed with repeating rifles and sidearms patrolled the vicinity of the court house and searched all persons who entered.

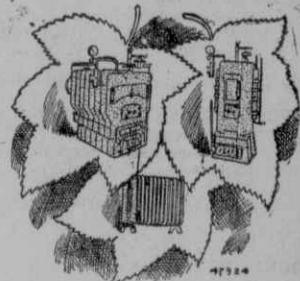
Marks Hit New Low Level
