of the party. The Oregon Short Line Railroad Co. were assessed for the year 1922 with Tax Number 5. Section 25, Twp. 5 So., Range 10 East B. M. The above Company presented a request for the cancellation of this tax based on the fact that the same was a part of their operating property and therefore assessed by the State Board of Equalization, which fact their correspondence recited the assessor acknowledged. Therefore the Commissioners ordered cancellation of delinquency certificate No. 1505 for year 1922, which certificate covers the assessments of above property for said year. The Board ordered cancellation of the improvement assessed on Lot 1, block 44, South Addition to Hammett for year 1925 based on report of the Assessor that there were no improvements on said lot, covered by tax receipt No. 4344 year 1925. Chris Hendricks, deputy assessor, appeared in behalf of E. P. Money requesting cancellation of the 1925 tax on mining machinery from the fact that said property was not in the county on the second Monday of January of said year. Therefore the Commissioners ordered cancellation of tax receipt No. 5842 for 1925. Dr. W. A. Sullivan of the U. S. Bureau of Animal Industry appeared before the Board explaining the economic advantages of a test of the cattle of the county for tuberculosis as the same applied to the health and welfare of the public as well as the financial advantage. Dr. Sullivan explained that in his judgment the cost of such a test in Elmore County would run around \$500.00. The Commissioners at this time, however, took the matter of a tuberculosis test of the cattle of Elmore County, both as to dairy and range cattle, under advisement. This being the day and hour set for the hearing of the qualified electors with regard to the creation of a herd district near Hill City on Big Camas Prairie. Thereupon the Board examined the records filed in this matter and found that both proof of posting and proof of publication of the notice of hearing had been made and filed in this proceeding. No formal protest was filed in this matter but Lou Ibrig appeared in person to offer protest to the formation of such herd district. At length a compromise was effected by which the boundary lines in the petition were effected which was satisfactory to the majority. The Board being fully advised in the premises, upon motion duly put and carried, ordered that a herd district, the boundaries of which are hereinafter set forth and described be and the same hereby is ordered created and established. That, in accordance with the prayer of the petition herein, all horses, mules, cattle, asses, swine, sheep (Continued on page five)
