OCTOBER, 1918, SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LINCOLN COUNTY.

Be it remembered that on this 14th day of October, 1918, in pursuance to law, the Board of County Commissioners met this day in regular session.

The following claims against the Current Expense Fund of the county were examined and allowed:

The claim for the Richfield Highway and Bridge in the sum of \$1,100.00 was examined and allowed.

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter fifty-three Session Laws of the State of Idaho for the year 1917, the State Engineer having filed with the County Recorder a statement of the costs and expenses of constructing head gates...

The report of Thomas Fay as water master of the Gooding Mott ditch in the vicinity of Shoshone, Idaho, and the report of James Devaney as water master of the Big Wood River is hereby allowed and warrants are ordered issued to the said water masters as shown on their official reports.

In the matter of the delinquent taxes on Lot 12, Block 109, Village of Jerome, it appearing to the board that the same has been erroneously assessed in the years 1914, 1915 and 1916 and W. J. Walker appearing before the board offered to compromise by paying \$10.50 for taxes for the years of 1914, 1915, 1916 and 1917...

Whereupon the board adjourned until November 11th, 1918.
