O. H. TRUMAN VICTIM OF INFLUENZA.

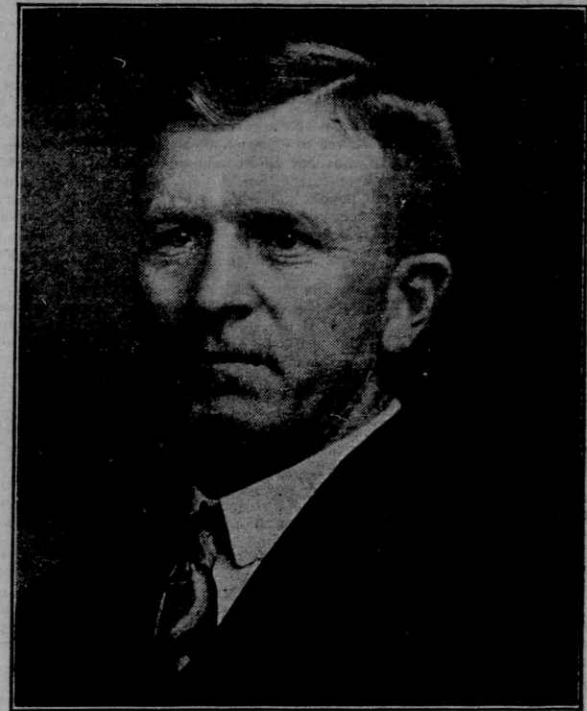
O. H. Truman received the sad news a few days ago of the death of his twin brother, at Long Beach, Cal., Monday, November fourth. Mr. Truman left Shoshone but a few weeks ago. Recently he contracted influenza, which developed into pneumonia, which resulted in his death. The body was shipped for burial to Mr. Truman's daughter at La Cross, Kansas, the old family home.

Mr. Truman was a minister of the Christian faith, and was deeply interested in the history of all religious movements. He is the author of several published lectures on religious subjects, the latest being "The World's Great Movements and the Coming Revolution." These lectures show the result of years of deep thought and laborious research. Mr. Truman predicted thirty years ago, the great war which has just ended.

Mr. Truman was a man of rare culture and refinement, a Christian gentleman in the highest sense of the word. The news of his death will bring sorrow to all who knew him.
