Insolvency Notice.

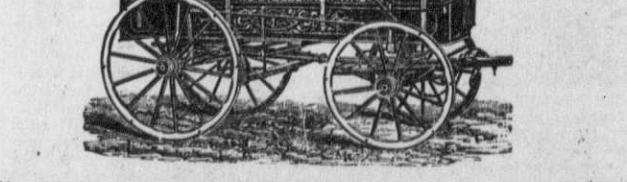
