Good Record of Congressman Addison T. Smith

Addison T. Smith of Twin Falls, who has been renominated for congress in the primaries without opposition has actively supported the government's plans for preparedness and consistently sustained the president in all his recommendations for the enactment of emergency legislation and ample appropriations for the conduct of the war. He is the author of a bill, which has attracted the attention of the leaders of both branches of congress and is strongly recommended by Secretary Lane for enactment next session, to provide for returning soldiers on reclaimed arid, swamp and cut-over lands, under the provisions of which soldiers and sailors will have the preference right of employment and entry.

Congressman Smith has been active in support of prohibition legislation, woman's suffrage, rural credits, the fixing of a price for wheat, which will encourage ample production and give the farmers a fair profit. He has also advocated legislation to regulate the price of farm machinery, vehicles,

harness and other commodities farmers have to buy. He has specialized on the enactment of legislation for the benefit of settlers on the public land and has several laws of this character to his credit.

He initiated and carried to a successful conclusion legislation providing for the government to take over the King Hill Irrigation Project, for which \$600,000 was appropriated, saving to the settlers their homes and earnings of years. A bill which he introduced over a year ago, has been made the basis of a systematic plan, strongly endorsed by the administration, to encourage private capital to invest in irrigation bonds where the projects are constructed by the reclamation service, under which the Bruneau, North Side-Mindoka, Fort Hall and other proposed irrigation projects will be constructed. His prompt and intelligent attention to the requests of his constituents has attracted to him a large personal following regardless of parties, who are interested in his reelection.

DWIGHT M. GRUBER WRITES ABOUT FORT WORDEN.

Mrs. John Gruber, residing near Meridian, has received a letter from her son, Dwight, now of the 40th Co. C. A. P. S., Fort Worden, Wash. in which he says:

"I am well and feeling great. It has not rained since I came but it is foggy most every morning. This morning it fogged to lift and so it stayed until afternoon when it lifted and the sun shone out fine and nice. The fog horn on Ft. Wilson boomed out at twenty-second intervals all the time. The Ft. is just below the main battery of guns and is the most northern point of the peninsula upon which we are. Across on the north side of the sound is British Columbia and some of the old men say that on clear nights you can see Victoria sixty-five miles away.

"I had my qualification card made out Friday and was classed as a driver in the artillery. Will be assigned to the heavy artillery, but I don't know a thing about where I will go from here or when.

"This is quite a large fort, there being about 2,000 men here now, and some more are coming in soon. We were up "the hill" yesterday putting up tents for them. We are in large wooden barracks just like those in all the cantonments, with stoves in them. But the new comers will have to use tents for a little while.

"This fort is the largest guarding Puget sound, and I saw some of the batteries. They have several 12-inch disappearing guns and barbettes and trench mortars. Before the war there were about 50 guns mounted here, and we can't say how many are here now.

"At night searchlights sweep the water all the time and at Ft. Casey just across the water, it is the same, so you can see that the kaiser has a fat chance of getting in.

"This week our work with the guns confounds and also our company has to stand guard. There are sentries everywhere here, you can't go very far without being stopped.

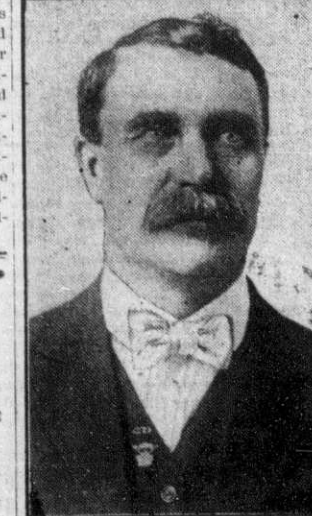
"The scenery is very pretty here, with trees everywhere. The guns are all up on a hill, while the buildings are down on the beach. It is kept clean and nice just like all army posts. It is just about 15 minutes walk to Port Townsend.

"We are quarantined in our barracks for two weeks as usual and also the whole post is quarantined.

"Out of our brave and gallant company of 100 there were only about 40 out for retreat to-night. The rest are in the hospital with colds and grippe. Fred Gracey went yesterday, but there is nothing to be afraid of as there are only a few cases of the real "flu." They spray our throats every night to prevent sore throat etc.

Will close, hoping to hear from all soon. Affectionately, Dwight."

Note—Fred Gracey mentioned in the above letter died this week of influenza. He was a Boise boy, and was a very warm friend of Dwight Gruber.—Ed.
