TO BUILD DRIER**

The agent for the Earl Fruit Co., in Meridian, P. J. McDonough, who had charge of the company's business last year and who bought many carloads of fruit of the growers in this vicinity, came to Meridian Monday, with his family, and will make this place their home.

He says the company will improve their property in the warehouse district, which already has a warehouse on it, with a modern packing house and that the work of construction will begin at once. He has six builders who will arrive from Oregon in a few days, and will employ a considerable amount of local help in putting up the building.

The dimensions of the building are not announced, but it will compare favorably with the plants of the McBirney interests, the Idaho Products Co. and the Co-Operative plants, and is one more building to establish Meridian's reputation as the fruit-drying headquarters of the northwest. Already the capacity of the three mammoth driers is not excelled by any place in the Pacific northwest, and the Earl Fruit Co.'s new building will be a worthy addition to the list. The company will carry on an extensive business of drying prunes, apples, etc.

NOTICE.

To Water Users of Nampa and Meridian Irrigation District:

It seems to be a very common practice of the water users from our canal system to waste water into the drains constructed by the United States Reclamation Service for our Irrigation District without providing a waste water ditch and connecting the same with the drain boxes provided for this purpose.

Regarding this matter, I wish to say that this practice cannot be tolerated for the reason that to waste irrigation water over the banks into a drain at a point where no drain box is provided, will have a tendency to fill up the drain and, in time, make it necessary for our District to provide itself with expensive dredging machinery for the purpose of cleaning its drainage canals and thus increase the maintenance cost.

Trusting that all water users along our drainage system will cooperate with the officials of our District in this matter and provide the necessary waste water ditches, I remain
