MOVED EACH DAY**

NORTHERN PACIFIC RUSHING
FARM PRODUCTS TO MARKET
—LARGEST TONNAGE IN MANY
YEARS.

At no time in the history of the Northern Pacific railway during the past five years has there been such activity in the freight department as now exists.

There is not an idle engine, car or trainman on the whole system. Everything and everybody is working hard to move the immense crops that have been harvested and are now awaiting transportation.

At the present time there is being moved over the Northern Pacific farm crops at the rate of over 50 cars per day, and this movement will be extended to double the amount but what all the farm crops will find an outlet.

Every siding between the terminus of the Clearwater branch at Stites and the connecting points with the main line is standing full of cars ready to be loaded, and they are being filled with grain, fruits and cattle and are as quickly being transported and sent to the market.

Some idea of the magnitude of the tonnage to be moved from the prairie country alone may be had when it is considered that to transport the crop of wheat from the farm to market will require something over 7,500 cars and when the number of cars required to move the cattle, hogs and fruit is added to this large number the aggregate will reach more than 10,000 cars.

This would mean the movement of at least 30 carloads of farm produce for every day in the year—sufficient work to keep busy one good branch of any well-equipped railway, and in money would represent an inflow of money into this country of \$10,000,000.

A country with such a crop to move, and actually moving it, need not dwell upon the subject of hard times. Everything should go right ahead, no business should suffer for the lack of any confidence, and all enterprise should move forward with ease and security.

President Davis, of the Alaska Mine Workers' Union, has succeeded in his effort to form an alliance with the Western Federation of Miners, and it is said that there will be a renewal of the warfare between the miners' union and the operators in the Tanana (Alaska) district when the sluicing season begins next April.
