## STEAMERS CARRY FOOD TO STARVING

**ONE NEW STEAMER BUILT ON PACIFIC COAST CARRIES A VALUABLE CARGO**

Two steamers under the direction of the American committee for relief in the near east sailed from New York with \$2,500,000 worth of foodstuffs and other supplies for the suffering people of Asia Minor. The steamers were the Mercurius, which was an ammunition carrier during the war and which was turned over to the committee by the navy department, and the steamer Eastern Belle, recently built for the Emergency Fleet Corporation.

The above information was received at the Inter-mountain branch in Spokane yesterday from the New York headquarters, and tells something of what is being done with the funds now being raised to relieve the suffering in the near east.

In the \$1,000,000 cargo stowed away below hatches and on the docks of the Mercurius is to be found every variety of article needed for the relief of the Armenians, Syrians, Persians, Greeks and Jews who, ever since the outbreak of the war in 1914, have suffered from the ravages of famine, plague and destitution. The inventory ranged from spoons and needles to two-ton motor trucks.

flour, which was purchased by the American Committee for Relief in the near east for \$1,500,000 with the approval of the United States Food Administration and the Inter-Allied Food conference of which Herbert C. Hoover is head.

The Mercurius will race across the Atlantic with the Western Belle, and will contest every mile of the trip with her rival for the honor of landing relief goods first. The Mercurius and the Western Belle both have navy crews, and are commanded by naval officers. Captain Cateb L. Morris is in charge of the Mercurius and Ensign Wayland of the Western Belle.

This is the Western Belle's maiden trip. She came from the yards of the Columbia River Shipbuilding company through the Panama canal to this port shortly after the signing of the armistice.

**Nat C. Goodwin Dead.**  
NEW YORK. — Nat C. Goodwin, noted actor, died in his hotel here today after a brief illness. Death was due to a general breakdown following an operation for the removal of his right eye several months ago.

**REPUBLICANS OPPOSED THE REFERENDUM MEASURE**

BOISE.—Speaker Kiger and Representative Young were the only republicans to vote in favor of the initiative member which would place in the hands of the people the power to initiate amendments to the state constitution. The resolution by Representative Greenwood of Minidoka which asked the sanction of the legislature of the initiative power was killed in the reference committee and the resulting vote was on the adoption of the committee report.

Greenwood refused to allow the principle to remain a corpse and immediately introduced a second measure to allow electors at large the power to enact laws.
