The Whimsical Spark.

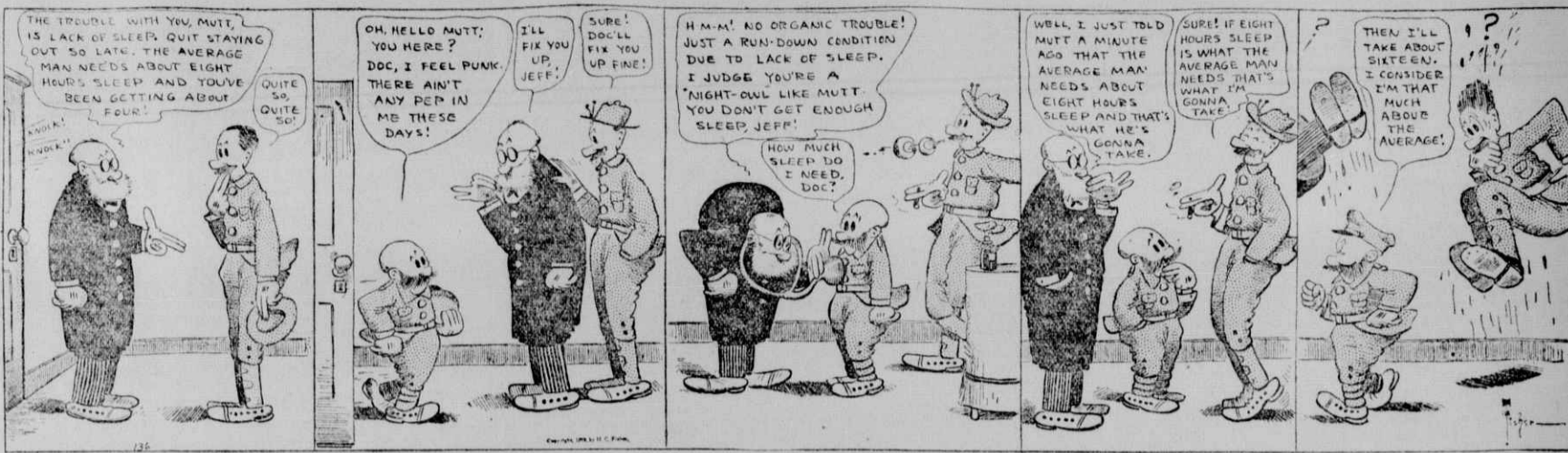
