

## STATE CHAIRMEN NAMED TO HANDLE MEMORIAL FUNDS

Gooding Selects Those Who Will Assist Roosevelt Association in Raising Idaho's Quota.

### BLAINE FOR ADA COUNTY

Widespread Interest Manifested All Over State in Plan to Pay Tribute to Memory of Theodore Roosevelt.

Reports to the state headquarters of the Roosevelt Memorial association for Idaho denote widespread interest in the plans as announced by Frank R. Gooding, the state chairman.

The state program includes organization by counties, memorial sermons on Sunday, Oct. 26, exercises in schools and suitable action by various organizations. The campaign will be conducted during the week of Oct. 20-27.

Chairman Gooding says the work of organization is well in hand and he has every assurance of a prompt and generous response on behalf of the men, women and children of this state.

He has designated Guy Plenner as director of publicity and public speaking for the memorial association for Idaho and that department is getting in touch with the press and with the various organizations, including the American Legion of Idaho, the lodges and others.

## CENTRAL REVENUE OFFICE WILL OPEN SMALLER STATIONS

System of Branch Agencies in Larger Towns of Idaho Are Planned by Collector in Boise Headquarters.

Taxpayers of income tax in Idaho, as well as those paying tax on admissions, dues, transportation, telephone and telegram messages, soft drinks, jewelry, luxury and all other forms of government tax should in the future file their returns with Lewis Williams, collector of internal revenue in Boise. Recognizing the importance of giving citizens of Idaho better service in providing means for their payment of federal government taxes, the bureau of internal revenue has established the office here.

In the past taxpayers of the state have sent their returns to the collector's office at Helena, Mont. The district of Idaho has been created out of the old Montana district by the internal revenue bureau and taxpayers of Idaho will no longer be required to report to the Montana district.

It is important that payers of internal revenue taxes take notice of this fact. Collector Williams announces. Besides having the central office at Boise, the bureau has made arrangements to establish service stations at other principal cities in the state. This will be a great convenience to the taxpayers.

Competent officials will be in charge of these stations, prepared to advise taxpayers how to make out their returns. This service will be free of cost and will be given cheerfully during business hours.

While the service stations will not be in operation for a short time due to the great amount of work necessary in the establishment of the central office at Boise, taxpayers should forward their returns to the Boise office, addressed to "Collector of Internal Revenue." Opening of the service stations will be announced later.
