Republic Closes

The Republic Iron and Steel Co. plant closed down last evening with the official announcement that operations at the East Chicago mills would be suspended for an indefinite period.

With a revival in the bar iron market, which is expected the first part of 1922, the local plant will resume work, it is said.

More than 400 men were thrown out of employment as the result of this shut-down.

People up in Arms

With blood in their eyes people of the south side of East Chicago threw out a challenge to the street car company that they would fight to their last dollar to compel them to pave 150th street, when gathering at a mass meeting in Krupa's hall last night.

Many city officials among whom were members of the common council, addressed the meeting and informed the people as to their recent action by the council to compel the street car company to pave their right-of-ways on 150th street. As ordered by the council two weeks ago:

1.—File an affidavit in the East Chicago city against the street car company for not complying with the penal section of the city ordinance ordering the Green Line to pave their right of way on 150th street.

2.—Appeal to the Appellate court against which relieved the street car company from the city ordinance, for a reversed decision.

3.—In the meantime repair this street car right of way as a safety means until after the controversy is settled.

The people before concluding their meeting concurred in and agreed that this was the only action to take.
