70,000 FRENCH WOMEN SERVING WITH RED CROSS

BOOKS FOR SOLDIERS.

Do soldiers really need books? Yes. "I don't know how we should live without your circulating libraries," writes one wounded soldier to the British Library association.

True, the men at the Officers' Training camps work and study all day long. We have all heard how the officers at Fort Benjamin Harrison work sixteen hours a day—yet it is a fact that the three thousand volumes now in their library are circulated once every ten days.

The Red Cross society serves chiefly the sick and wounded, which is less than ten per cent of the enlisted men of any country in the present war. The Y. M. C. A. Knights of Columbus, Y. M. H. A., and other organizations of this kind have failed to provide adequate reading for the men, so the U. S. War Department has left this job to the libraries and library workers of the country.

WAR CRANKS IN WASHINGTON
