Philadelphia Central is lodging 270 drafted and enlisted men besides giving them frequent automobile trips and entertainment.

(United Press Cablegram.) COPENHAGEN, Nov. 14.—General Korniloff's troops have captured the Kremlin, where Bolshevik forces in Moscow took refuge, according to "reliable reports," which the Berlinische Tidende printed this afternoon.

(United Press Cablegram.) LONDON, Nov. 14.—The fight against Premier Lloyd-George's support of an inter-allied war council came to a head in the house of commons this afternoon when the premier himself took the floor to explain the agreement creating the organization.

CONTRACTORS MUST OBEY U. S. LAW

Hardware Man and Others Affected by U. S. Explosive License Law.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 14.—Under the Federal Explosives Act, which goes into effect Nov. 15, every person found in possession of explosives who does not hold a United States license for this purpose will be liable to arrest and a fine of \$5,000 or one year's imprisonment.

Special measures are being taken for the enforcement of the law, which will be under the direction of the bureau of mines. A committee of chiefs of police of large cities is co-operating. The Federal Bureau does not relieve any person from state laws and local ordinances also, requiring permits, manufacturers, importers, exporters, sellers and purchasers must have licenses and contractors, mining companies or quarrymen may issue explosives to their employees only through these employees possessing what will be termed a foramen's license.
