NEW YORK, April 5.—Announcement that the National German Alliance will disband at a special meeting in Philadelphia on April 11 was made here tonight by Henry Weisman of this city, who until recently was active in the affairs of the organization.

"I imagine, however, that a quiet tip has gone out from Washington that the organization had better take advantage of an opportunity to dissolve voluntarily."
